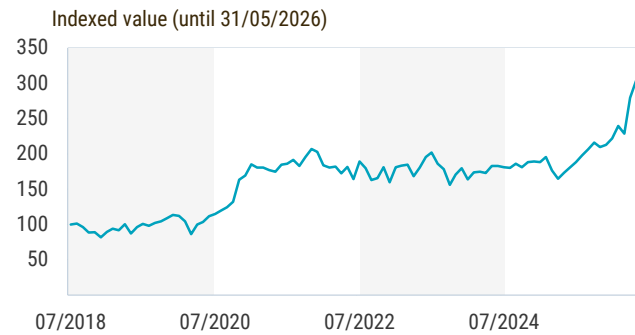

Robeco Smart Mobility is an actively managed fund that invests globally in companies involved in electric or fuel cell vehicle production including components and the entire value chain. The selection of these stocks is based on fundamental analysis. The fund has sustainable investment as its objective, within the meaning of Article 9 of the Regulation (EU) 2019/2088 of 27 November 2019 on Sustainability-related disclosures in the financial sector. The strategy integrates sustainability criteria as part of the stock selection process and through a theme-specific sustainability assessment. The portfolio is built on the basis of an eligible investment universe that includes companies whose business models contribute to the thematic investment objectives. The assessment regarding relevant SDGs uses an internally developed framework, more information on which can be obtained at www.robeco.com/si.

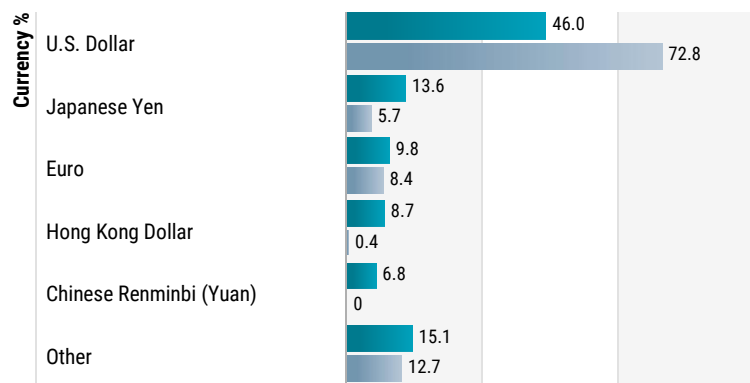
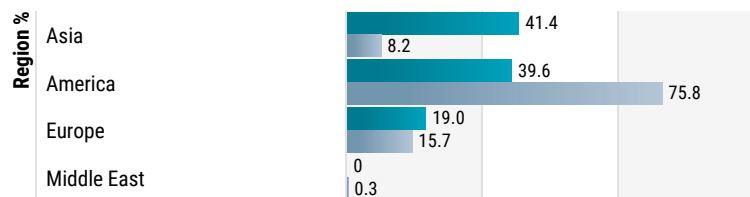
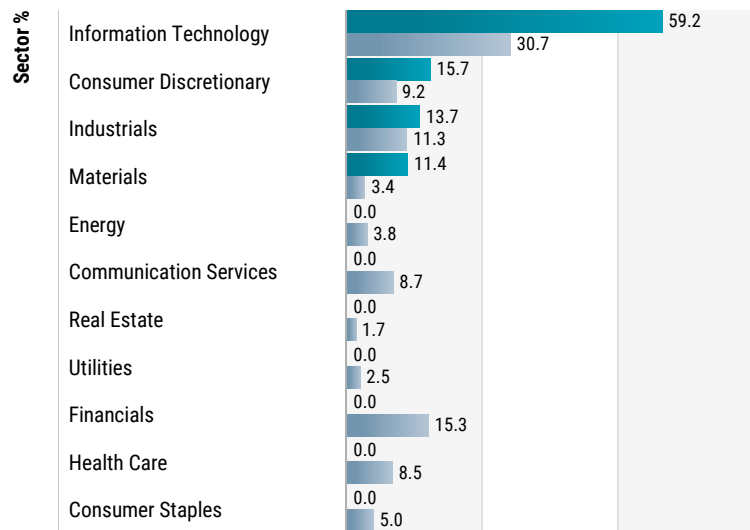

Performance commentary

Based on transaction prices, the fund's return was 8.79%.

The portfolio delivered a very strong month, well ahead of the MSCI World. Leaders clustered around one thesis: electrification and AI-infrastructure demand converging into the same silicon, passives, power systems and test equipment. Power-semiconductor and analog names led (Infineon, STMicroelectronics, onsemi, Texas Instruments, Qualcomm) as turning auto and industrial bookings met structural data center demand. Infineon re-rated most clearly on a deepened NVIDIA AI-factory tie; STMicroelectronics rallied on improving auto demand, and Qualcomm posted record automotive revenue and its first hyperscaler win. The same convergence lifted Murata, TDK, Renesas, Chroma ATE and Delta Electronics. Laggards split in two: margin compression across the Chinese EV and autonomy complex (BYD, Leapmotor, Hesai, Horizon Robotics) amid the robotaxi-safety review, and the battery-materials chain (LG Chem, Yunnan Energy, Albemarle, SQM) squeezed by uneven adoption and lithium volatility. Advantest and Trainline fell on profit-taking and a UK-specific story.

Market development

China kept setting penetration records (near 62.5% in May), even as volumes fell approximately 24% year-on-year. Europe accelerated, with April's BEV registrations up 37.7%. The standout was emerging markets, where the IEA's 2026 outlook confirmed a structural inflection: sales outside China rose approximately 80% in 2025 to almost 1.2 mln units, with affordable Chinese imports being the engine. Autonomy commercialization. Waymo grew its service area over 20% and raised USD 16 bln at a USD 126 bln valuation, yet paused freeway service after a vehicle entered a flooded road. In China, a safety review followed a Baidu outage. Tesla's FSD Supervised reached Lithuania – still Level 2, not Waymo's driverless autonomy.

Expectation of fund manager

The underlying fundamentals (as reflected by the core themes addressed by the strategy) are very robust. Technology companies with strong and sustainable moats remain the focus of the strategy's investments. These companies focus on the development of high-voltage electric, low-voltage electronic and software-managed solutions that enable electrification, connectivity and autonomous driving. Other key enabling technologies include battery management systems, power inverters and artificial intelligence (AI). The strategy will also continue to seek exposure to the EV market as well as to companies helping to develop EV infrastructure worldwide. Continued momentum in electrification and autonomy will make 2026 a seminal year for Smart Mobility.

Top 10 largest holdings

Infineon – leverages SiC and GaN power semiconductors to boost efficiency in traction inverters, on-board chargers and DC-DC converters, accelerating greener, smarter mobility; CATL – global leader in EV and energy-storage batteries, driving electrification through advances in cell chemistry, fast-charging and battery-as-a-service models; Texas Instruments – supplies analog and embedded processing semiconductors for automotive applications including motor control, BMS front ends, and in-vehicle networking; ST Microelectronics – provides SiC power devices, microcontrollers and sensors for traction systems, vehicle electrification and advanced driver assistance; Analog Devices – delivers precision sensing, power management and high-bandwidth connectivity chips that enable fast charging, zonal vehicle architectures and quiet, data-rich cabins.

Sector allocation

The fund invests in companies exposed to structural growth trends of the 'Smart Mobility' theme. As a consequence, the portfolio is particularly invested in companies in the technology sector, followed by the industrial and consumer discretionary sectors.

Regional allocation

The fund invests globally. Most exposure is to US-listed stocks, followed by China, Japan, the Eurozone, Switzerland, Taiwan, Chile and South Korea.

Currency allocation

The fund has no currency hedges in place. This means the currency allocation is a reflection of the investments of the fund.

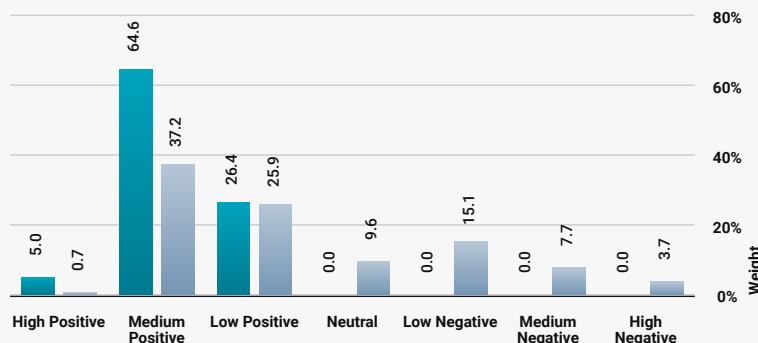

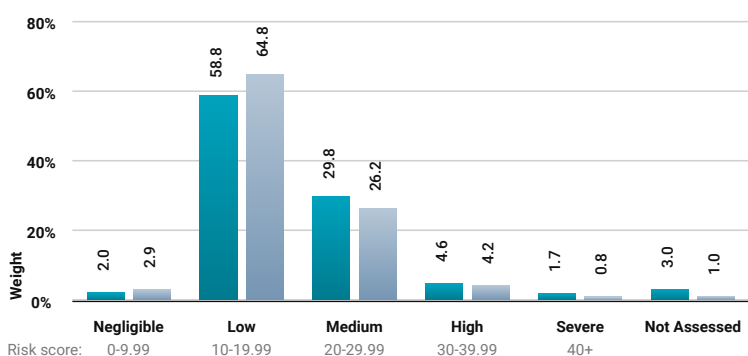

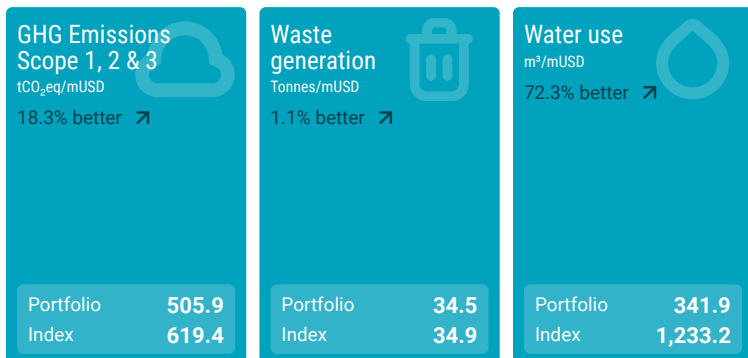

The fund furthes the decarbonization of the global transportation sector through investments in its electrification by investing in companies that advance the following UN Sustainable Development Goals (UN SDGs): Affordable and Clean Energy goal, Decent work and economic growth, Industry, innovation and infrastructure, Sustainable cities and communities, and Climate Action. The fund integrates ESG (Environmental, Social and Governance) factors in the investment process and applies sustainability indicators, including but not limited to Robeco's Good Governance policy, normative, activity-based and region-based exclusions, carbon reduction target and proxy voting.

1. SDG Impact Alignment

This distribution across SDG scores shows the portfolio weight allocated to companies with a positive, negative and neutral impact alignment with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) based on Robeco's SDG Framework. The framework utilizes a three-step approach to assess a company's impact alignment with the relevant SDGs and assign a total SDG score. The score ranges from positive to negative impact alignment with levels from high, medium or low impact alignment. Only holdings mapped as corporates are included in the figures.

2. Sustainalytics ESG Risk Rating

The chart displays the portfolio's Sustainalytics ESG Risk Rating. This is calculated by multiplying each portfolio component's Sustainalytics ESG Risk Rating by its respective portfolio weight. The distribution across Sustainalytics ESG Risk levels chart shows the portfolio allocations broken into Sustainalytics' five ESG risk levels: negligible (0-10), low (10-20), medium (20-30), high (30-40) and severe (40+), providing an overview of portfolio exposure to the different ESG risk levels.

4. Environmental Footprint

Environmental footprint expresses the total resource consumption of the portfolio per mUSD invested. Each assessed company's footprint is calculated by normalizing resources consumed by the company's enterprise value including cash (EVIC). We aggregate these figures to portfolio level using a weighted average, multiplying each assessed portfolio constituent's footprint by its respective position weight. The equivalent factors that are used for comparison between the portfolio and index (where applicable) represent European averages and are based on third-party sources combined with own estimates. As such, the figures presented are intended for illustrative purposes and are purely an indication. Only holdings mapped as corporates are included in the figures.

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5. Engagement

Robeco distinguishes between three types of engagement. Value Engagement focuses on long-term issues that are financially material and/or are causing adverse sustainability impacts. The themes can be broken into Environmental, Social, Governance, or Voting-related. SDG Engagement aims to drive a clear and measurable improvement in a company's SDG contribution. Enhanced engagement is triggered by misconduct and focuses on companies severely breaching international standards. The report is based on all companies in the portfolio for which engagement activities have taken place during the past 12 months. Note that companies may be under engagement in multiple categories simultaneously. While the total portfolio exposure excludes double counting, it may not equal the sum of individual category exposures.

Risk management

Risk management is fully integrated into the investment process to ensure that positions always meet the investment guidelines.

Fiscal product treatment

The fund is established in Luxembourg and is subject to the Luxembourg tax laws and regulations. The fund is not liable to pay any corporation, income, dividend or capital gains tax in Luxembourg. The fund is subject to an annual subscription tax ('tax d'abonnement') in Luxembourg, which amounts to 0.05% of the net asset value of the fund. This tax is included in the net asset value of the fund. The fund can in principle use the Luxembourg treaty network to partially recover any withholding tax on its income.

Fiscal treatment of investor

The fiscal consequences of investing in this fund depend on the investor's personal situation. For private investors in the Netherlands real interest and dividend income or capital gains received on their investments are not relevant for tax purposes. Each year investors pay income tax on the value of their net assets as at 1 January if and inasmuch as such net assets exceed the investor's tax-free allowance. Any amount invested in the fund forms part of the investor's net assets. Private investors who are resident outside the Netherlands will not be taxed in the Netherlands on their investments in the fund. However, such investors may be taxed in their country of residence on any income from an investment in this fund based on the applicable national fiscal laws. Other fiscal rules apply to legal entities or professional investors. We advise investors to consult their financial or tax adviser about the tax consequences of an investment in this fund in their specific circumstances before deciding to invest in the fund.

Dividend policy

In principle the fund does not intend to distribute dividend and so both the income earned by the fund and its overall performance are reflected in its share price.
