Robeco Euro Government Bonds is an actively managed fund that invests predominantly in euro government bonds. The selection of these bonds is based on fundamental analysis. The fund's objective is to provide long term capital growth. The fund invests in euro denominated bonds issued by the EMU-member countries. It employs an investment process combining top-down and bottom-up elements. Fundamental analysis is performed on each of the three performance drivers: country allocation, duration (interest rate sensitivity) management and yield curve positioning. Country ESG scores are part of our bottom-up analysis.

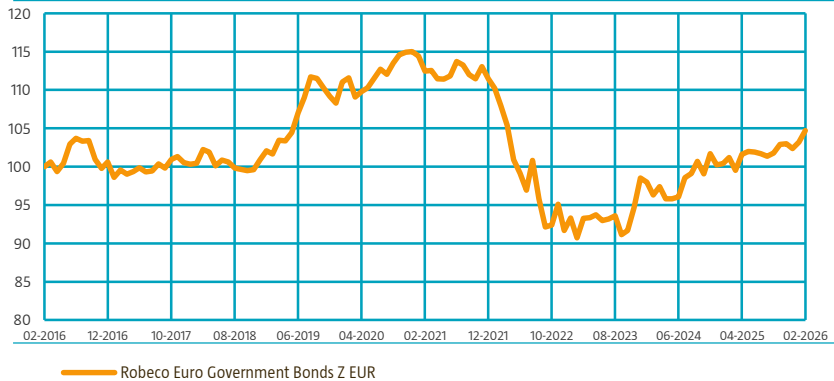

Performance

Based on transaction prices, the fund's return was 1.45%.

The fund marginally outperformed its benchmark in February. The overweight duration position was the main contributor to returns. As yields rallied significantly over the month, this duration overweight was gradually reduced in the later weeks. Curve dynamics were relatively muted overall, although elevated bond supply exerted some steepening pressure on the long end. Country and SSA spread positions contributed modestly, even though spreads drifted slightly wider from their tightest levels toward month-end.

Market development

Government bond returns were positive over February. 10-year US Treasuries ended the month 30 basis points lower at 3.94%, while the German Bund rallied by 20 basis points to 2.64%. In the UK, Gilts also rallied by 29 basis points to 4.23%. US Treasuries performed well over February, as US labor market data disappointed at the beginning of the month. US job openings surprised to the downside and unemployment claims were somewhat higher than expected. The US Supreme Court struck down the Trump administration's IEEPA tariffs. In response, the US president invoked a 10% global tariff rate under a different law. In Europe, the February ECB meeting showed that the central bank is not in a rush to change rates, with president Lagarde downplaying the importance of the recent strength in the euro. Toward the end of the month, yields globally continued to move lower in response to a possible US attack on Iran. European periphery spreads were mostly unchanged over the month.

Expectation of fund manager

Despite the neutral near-term guidance from the Fed, we continue to expect at least two additional 25 bps cuts this year. This outlook is premised on renewed signs of labor market cooling and a more dovish FOMC composition. May will likely be the first meeting chaired by Kevin Warsh. We then expect the Fed's easing bias to become more pronounced. For the ECB, we expect them to either keep rates unchanged in our base case for the upcoming quarters or potentially cut policy rates in response to an external shock. While the build-up of US military assets in the Middle East drove the bid in duration over past weeks, any further escalation could disrupt global oil supplies, particularly if tanker traffic through the Strait of Hormuz is impeded. This will likely have the reversed effect, with bond yields selling off instead. Peripheral bond spreads over Germany can continue to converge in a broader risk-friendly market environment, but in the shorter term, much will depend on whether tensions in the Middle East will ease, or will intensify further.

Sector allocation

Robeco Euro Government Bonds predominantly invests in euro-denominated government and government-related bonds issued by Eurozone countries or affiliated entities. Exposure to highly rated SSA bonds amounts to approximately 11%, while around 7% of the fund is invested in emerging hard currency bonds from Bulgaria, Hungary, Poland and Romania. ESG factors are considered when assessing the fundamental credit quality of individual issuers. At the end of the month, around 21% of the fund was invested in green, social, and sustainable bonds.

Duration allocation

The fund began the month with a sizeable overweight duration position, which proved beneficial for performance as bond yields declined throughout February. As the rally progressed, we gradually reduced this duration overweight, with the final adjustment implemented during the large index extension at month-end. After holding substantial curve-steepener positions for several months, we also decided to start scaling back this exposure. The supply wave in January and February has now largely passed, reducing one of the key steepening drivers. In addition, Dutch pension flows have so far been disappointing, with little visible impact on valuations. With the euro curve trading near its steepest levels of recent periods, we considered it prudent to unwind part of the steepener positions. At the same time, doing so effectively locks in the gains we have built up from this strategy over recent months.

Rating allocation

Approximately 34% of the fund is invested in AAA-rated bonds, consisting of German and Dutch government bonds and high-quality government-related issuers such as the EU, BNG, and KfW. The fund is underweight in French government bonds (A-rated), and is about 7% overweight in BBB-rated bonds, including Bulgarian, Greek, and Italian government securities.

Country allocation

We remain constructive on country and SSA spreads, though richer valuations make us selective in adding risk. The fund was active in the primary market, increasing exposure to Italian BTPs, where improving fundamentals and strong demand support our view that spreads can continue to grind tighter. We also added to government-related issuers such as the Flemish Community, lifting Belgium exposure, and participated in a new Croatian issue to close a small underweight. In addition, the fund took part in select semi-core supply, including the 30-year French OAT and a Spanish SPGB. We also added to Bulgaria ahead of its Bloomberg Euro Treasury Index inclusion in March and increased our EU allocation, valuing its AAA rating, strong liquidity, and attractive pickup versus core governments.

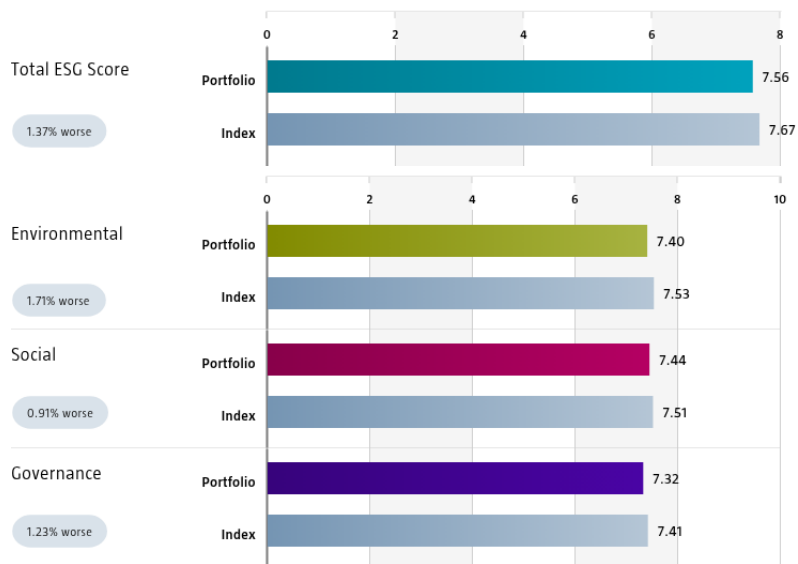
Sustainability

The fund incorporates sustainability in the investment process via exclusions, negative screening, ESG integration and a minimum average country sustainability ranking score as well as a minimum allocation to ESG-labeled bonds. The fund complies with Robeco's exclusion policy for countries and does not invest in countries where serious violations of human rights or a collapse of the governance structure take place, or if countries are subject to UN, EU or US sanctions. In addition, the fund excludes the 15% worst ranked countries following the World Governance Indicator 'Control of Corruption'. ESG factors of countries are integrated in the bottom-up country analysis. In the portfolio construction the fund ensures a minimum weighted average score of 6.5 following Robeco's proprietary Country Sustainability Ranking. The Country Sustainability Ranking scores countries on a scale from 1 (worst) to 10 (best) based on 40 environmental, social, and governance indicators. Lastly, the fund invests in a minimum of 10% in green, social, sustainable and/or sustainability-linked bonds. For more information please visit the sustainability-related disclosures.

Country Sustainability Ranking

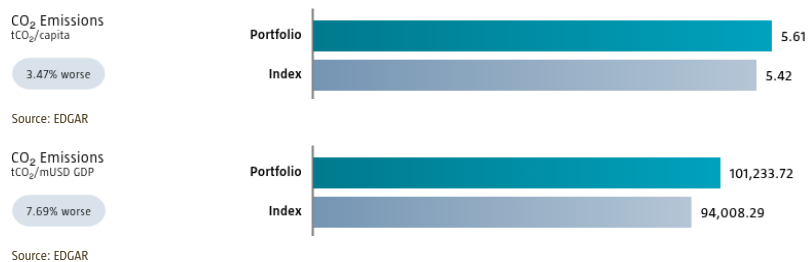

Environmental Intensity

Environmental intensity expresses a portfolio's aggregate environmental efficiency. The portfolio's aggregate carbon intensity is based on the related country emissions. We divide each country's carbon emissions, measured in tCO₂, by the population size or gross domestic product to obtain the country's carbon intensity. The portfolio's aggregate intensity figures are calculated as a weighted average by multiplying each assessed portfolio component's intensity figure with its respective position weight. Index intensities are provided alongside the portfolio intensities, highlighting the portfolio's relative carbon intensity. Only holdings mapped as sovereign bonds are included in the figures.

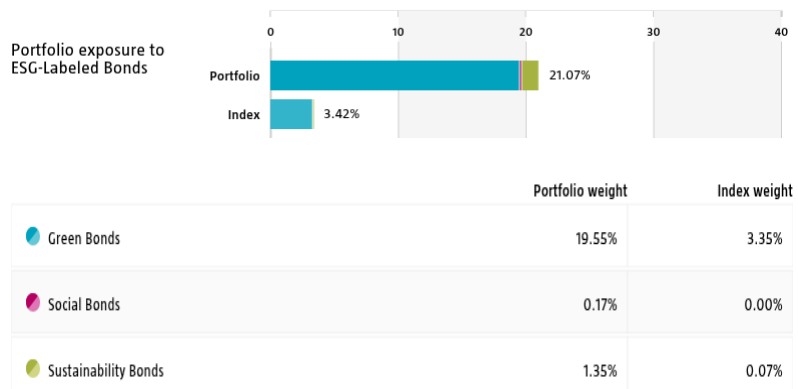

ESG Labeled Bonds

The ESG-labeled bond chart displays the portfolio's exposure to ESG-labeled bonds. Specifically, green bonds, social bonds, sustainability bonds, and sustainability-linked bonds. This is calculated as a sum of weights for those bonds in the portfolio that have one of above mentioned labels. The fund's objective is to provide long term capital growth. The fund invests in euro denominated bonds issued by the EMU-member countries. It employs an investment process combining top-down and bottom-up elements. Fundamental analysis is performed on each of the three performance drivers: country allocation, duration (interest rate sensitivity) management and yield curve positioning. Country ESG scores are part of our bottom-up analysis.

The fund promotes E&S (i.e. Environmental and Social) characteristics within the meaning of Article 8 of the European Sustainable Finance Disclosure Regulation, integrates sustainability risks in the investment process and applies Robeco's Good Governance policy. The fund applies sustainability indicators, including but not limited to, region-based exclusions and invest partly in green, social or sustainable bonds.
