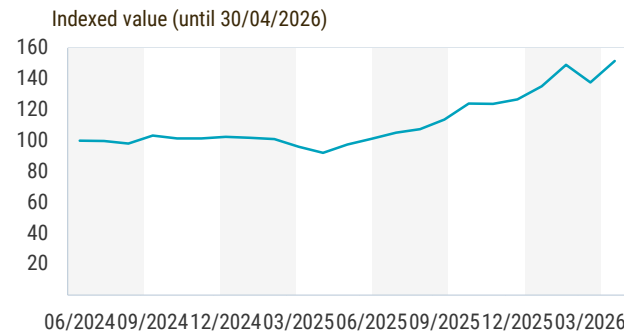

**About the fund**

Robeco Emerging Markets Climate Transition Equities is an actively managed sub-fund that invests in equities in emerging countries across the world. The Sub-fund will take exposure of at least two thirds of its total assets to equities of companies incorporated or exercising a preponderant part of their economic activities in Emerging Countries. The stock selection is based on fundamental analysis. The Sub-fund aims to make investments in assets that contribute to a climate transition. Climate transition pertains to the transitional efforts required to limit global temperature increase to well-below 2°C degrees, aligned with the goals of the Paris Agreement. This is achieved by investing in companies that are making the transition and companies are enabling the transition, as described in the Prospectus.

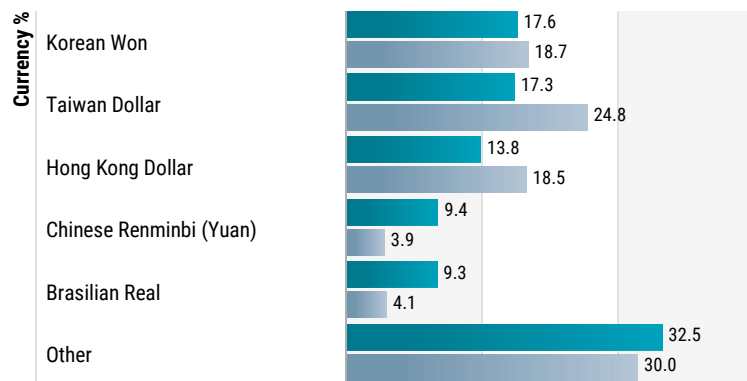
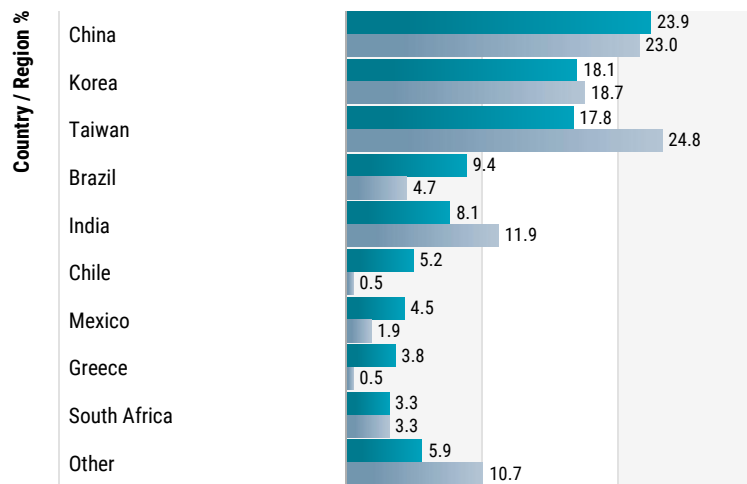
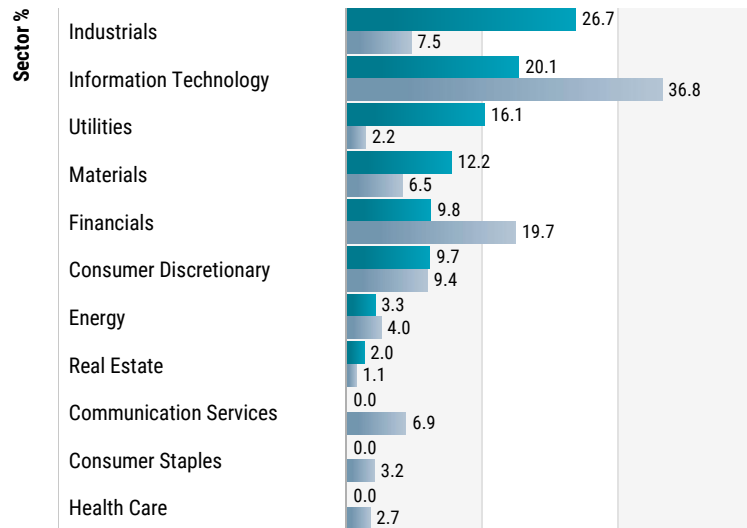

## Performance commentary

Based on transaction prices, the fund's return was 10.17%.

The fund underperformed versus the benchmark (MSCI EM Index) in April, primarily due to country allocation effects, partially offset by positive security selection. Our overweight positioning in Brazil, and underweight in Taiwan and South Korea contributed negatively on the back of the tech rally in those markets, while the underweight in India and China had positive effects. From a stock perspective the overweight in SK hynix holding co, SK Square in South Korea, added the most, followed by a strong performance of Taiwanese electric components manufacturer Delta Electronics. Energy generator Pertamina Geothermal, LatAm long steel maker Gerdau, and global electric equipment producer Hyundai Electric also contributed to positive stock selection. On the other hand, stocks in the electrification and renewables theme that outperformed in March saw profit-taking, highlighting Chinese solar energy and storage player Sungrow Power, electric equipment manufacturer Sieyuan Electric, solar equipment manufacturer Jinko Solar, two wheeler EV producer Yadea and LatAm copper miner Lundin Mining.

## Market development

Emerging market equities performed strongly in April, recovering from the weak March performance. The overall market was up 12.7% in euro terms, outperforming the 7.6% return for developed markets. An important driver was the ceasefire between the US and Iran, and hope for a deal that would allow the street of Hormuz to reopen. In addition, strong global AI investments are significantly lifting earnings expectations for technology companies. South Korea and Taiwan were the best-performing countries, and in particular the large technology sectors in these countries. Hungary also performed strongly following the large election victory for the Tisza party, likely leading to better relations with the EU. The worst-performing countries in April were Indonesia, Colombia, Peru, the Philippines and Saudi Arabia. Other relevant news was that MSCI announced that Greece will be reclassified to developed market status by May 2027, so the country will leave the EM index in a year's time. And in Brazil, the central bank cut the key policy interest rate by another 0.25%.

## Expectation of fund manager

The war in the Middle East is a significant shock with a big impact on the region and on global oil and gas prices. Even though the most likely scenario is that the war will be relatively short, risks do remain for a longer conflict and larger impact. Also economically, the US has become a source of more uncertainty on interest rate policy, import tariffs and policy making. Emerging markets are having to rely more on their own domestic policies and growth opportunities. We still expect higher structural economic growth compared to developed markets, while macroeconomic stability has significantly improved. Emerging equity markets' valuations have become attractive relative to developed markets, with discounts of more than 35% based on earnings multiples. Expected earnings growth is 46% for 2026 and 17% for 2027, both above developed markets.

## Top 10 largest holdings

Our top holdings are very diversified across EM sectors and sustainability themes, whereas the weight is distributed through connectivity, transition financing, mobility and heavy sector leaders. In IT, our biggest position is in TSMC, one of the largest semiconductors and supplier of chips globally and South Korean conglomerate SK Square, the controlling holding of memory chip manufacturer, SK hynix. We also hold positions in electronic components manufacturers Hon Hai Precision and Delta Electronics. Regarding financials, we are positioned in three leading regional banks, Itaú in Brazil, ABSA in South Africa, and KB Financial in South Korea. On the mobility theme, we have relevant exposure via EV battery producer Contemporary Amperex and in energy infrastructure, our biggest exposure is via Chinese equipment's producer Sieyuan Electric. Finally, we have a stake in transition materials through LatAm Copper producer Lundin Mining.

## Sector allocation

The main overweight sectors are industrials, utilities, and materials. In industrials, the portfolio holds companies active in EV battery manufacturing and its supply chain, electricity efficiency companies and rolling stock companies. In IT, there are companies active in semiconductor manufacturing, solar panel production and IT services. Utilities companies include renewable integrated players, geothermal producers, district cooling as well as transition energy players. Conversely, financials, communication services and consumer staples are the largest underweight positions compared to the benchmark.

## Country / Region allocation

In Asia, the main overweight positions are in South Korea and Indonesia. We are underweight in India and China. We are also underweight in some smaller Asian markets, such as Thailand, Malaysia and the Philippines. In Latin America, we are overweight in Brazil, Chile and Mexico. Among the EMEA countries, the fund is overweight in Greece, South Africa and the UAE. The fund has underweight positions in Saudi Arabia and Qatar.

## Currency allocation

The currency allocation largely reflects the country allocation. Positions in EUR and USD are primarily because of ADR/GDR positions.

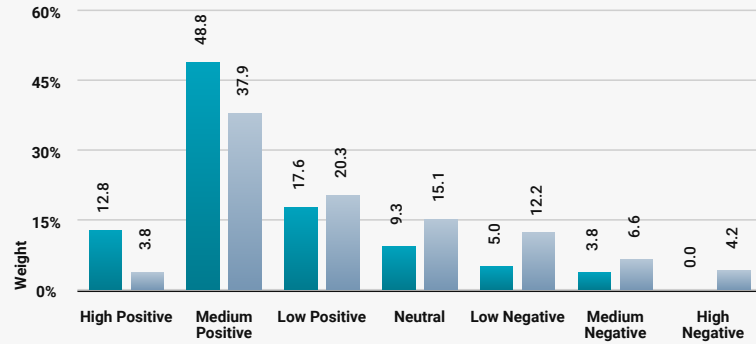

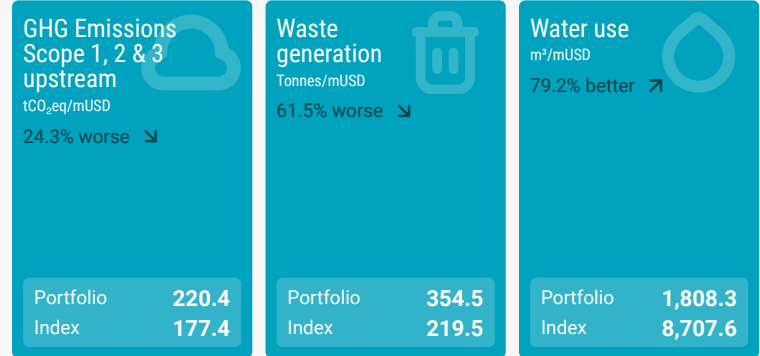
## SDG Impact Alignment <sup>1</sup>

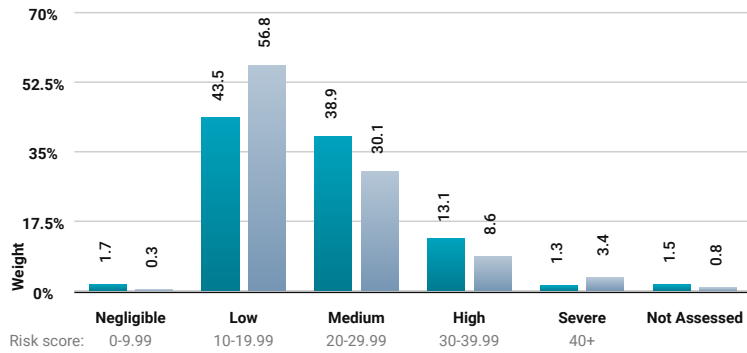
## Sustainalytics ESG Risk Rating <sup>3</sup>

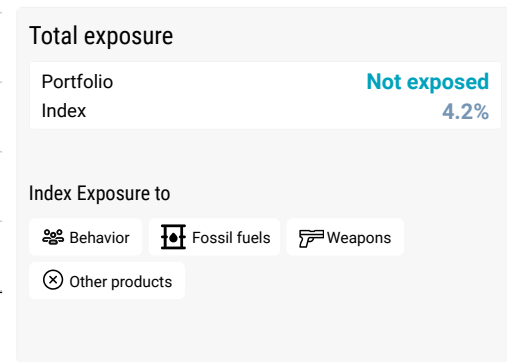

The fund applies sustainability indicators, including but not limited to, normative, activity-based and region-based exclusions, proxy voting and aims for an improved environmental footprint.

## Reference

### 1. SDG Impact Alignment

This distribution across SDG scores shows the portfolio weight allocated to companies with a positive, negative and neutral impact alignment with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) based on Robeco's SDG Framework. The framework utilizes a three-step approach to assess a company's impact alignment with the relevant SDGs and assign a total SDG score. The score ranges from positive to negative impact alignment with levels from high, medium or low impact alignment. Only holdings mapped as corporates are included in the figures.

### 2. Environmental Footprint

Environmental footprint expresses the total resource consumption of the portfolio per mUSD invested. Each assessed company's footprint is calculated by normalizing resources consumed by the company's enterprise value including cash (EVIC). We aggregate these figures to portfolio level using a weighted average, multiplying each assessed portfolio constituent's footprint by its respective position weight. The equivalent factors that are used for comparison between the portfolio and index (where applicable) represent European averages and are based on third-party sources combined with own estimates. As such, the figures presented are intended for illustrative purposes and are purely an indication. Only holdings mapped as corporates are included in the figures.

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### 3. Sustainalytics ESG Risk Rating

The chart displays the portfolio's Sustainalytics ESG Risk Rating. This is calculated by multiplying each portfolio component's Sustainalytics ESG Risk Rating by its respective portfolio weight. The distribution across Sustainalytics ESG Risk levels chart shows the portfolio allocations broken into Sustainalytics' five ESG risk levels: negligible (0-10), low (10-20), medium (20-30), high (30-40) and severe (40+), providing an overview of portfolio exposure to the different ESG risk levels.

### 5. Engagement

Robeco distinguishes between three types of engagement. Value Engagement focuses on long-term issues that are financially material and/or are causing adverse sustainability impacts. The themes can be broken into Environmental, Social, Governance, or Voting-related. SDG Engagement aims to drive a clear and measurable improvement in a company's SDG contribution. Enhanced engagement is triggered by misconduct and focuses on companies severely breaching international standards. The report is based on all companies in the portfolio for which engagement activities have taken place during the past 12 months. Note that companies may be under engagement in multiple categories simultaneously. While the total portfolio exposure excludes double counting, it may not equal the sum of individual category exposures.

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## Risk management

Risk management is fully integrated into the investment process to ensure that positions always meet predefined guidelines.

## Fiscal product treatment

The fund is established in Luxembourg and is subject to the Luxembourg tax laws and regulations. The fund is not liable to pay any corporation, income, dividend or capital gains tax in Luxembourg. The fund is subject to an annual subscription tax ('tax d'abonnement') in Luxembourg, which amounts to 0.05% of the net asset value of the fund. This tax is included in the net asset value of the fund. The fund can in principle use the Luxembourg treaty network to partially recover any withholding tax on its income.

## Fiscal treatment of investor

The fiscal consequences of investing in this fund depend on the investor's personal situation. For private investors in the Netherlands real interest and dividend income or capital gains received on their investments are not relevant for tax purposes. Each year investors pay income tax on the value of their net assets as at 1 January if and inasmuch as such net assets exceed the investor's tax-free allowance. Any amount invested in the fund forms part of the investor's net assets. Private investors who are resident outside the Netherlands will not be taxed in the Netherlands on their investments in the fund. However, such investors may be taxed in their country of residence on any income from an investment in this fund based on the applicable national fiscal laws. Other fiscal rules apply to legal entities or professional investors. We advise investors to consult their financial or tax adviser about the tax consequences of an investment in this fund in their specific circumstances before deciding to invest in the fund.

## Dividend policy

In principle the fund does not intend to distribute dividend and so both the income earned by the fund and its overall performance are reflected in its share price.
