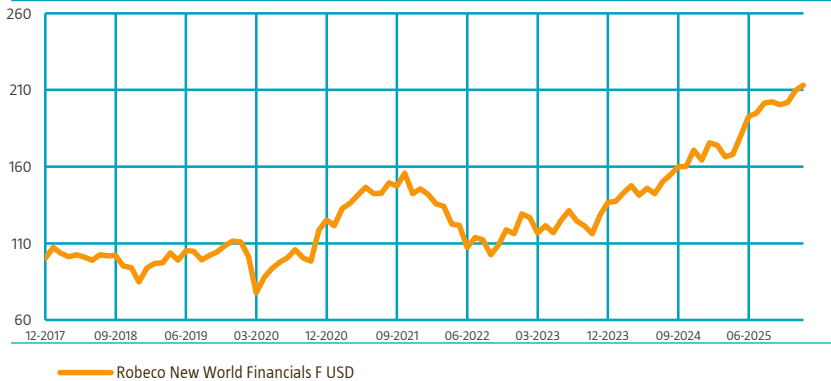

Performance

Based on transaction prices, the fund's return was 1.59%.

Robeco New World Financials outperformed its benchmark in January. Performance was driven by positive contributions from Aging Finance and Emerging Finance, while Digital Finance detracted. Top contributors included Itaú Unibanco, Grupo Financiero Banorte, AIA Group, Ping An, and Prudential, while Coinbase, Capital One, and Klarna weighed on returns. Insurance and financial services led gains, whereas capital markets and consumer finance lagged.

Market development

Market momentum continued into early 2026, with financials delivering solid earnings despite lagging the broader market in January, as US banks pointed to resilient consumers and benign credit conditions. Rising affordability concerns and populist rhetoric – particularly in the US – remain a sentiment risk, reinforcing the need to focus on policy actions over political noise. Aging Finance contributed positively, supported by a strong 2025Q4 earnings season. US investment banks signaled a favorable 2026 setup, with Goldman Sachs (+5%) highlighting rising IPO and advisory pipelines, while BNP (+13%) stood out in Europe on capital actions and legal clarity. Emerging Finance extended its strong 2025 momentum into January on solid 2025Q4 results and a constructive macro backdrop, led by Banorte (+21%), SNB (+17%), Itaú Unibanco (+18%), and Nu Holdings (+5%). Digital Finance detracted as Coinbase (-15%) and Capital One (-11%) fell on weaker crypto activity, regulatory uncertainty, and higher costs, partly offset by Interactive Brokers (+15%), which posted a strong 2025Q4 revenue beat, record 79.5% pre-tax margins, and continued robust account growth.

Expectation of fund manager

Global liquidity, interest rates, and central bank policies remain key drivers for equity markets, especially financials. Although a new inflationary regime is emerging, bond markets signal that peak rates are behind us, with a continued steepening yield curve supporting deposit-taking financials. After years of heavy post-GFC regulation, a gradual easing may improve earnings and capital efficiency, though changes will be slow. A weaker USD boosts the relative appeal of non-US assets. Aging Finance benefits from long term demand for retirement solutions, strong M&A and IPO pipelines, and growth in alternatives and life insurance. Emerging Finance remains supported by resilient economies, easing monetary policy, and attractive valuations. In Digital Finance, payments innovation offer significant structural opportunities.

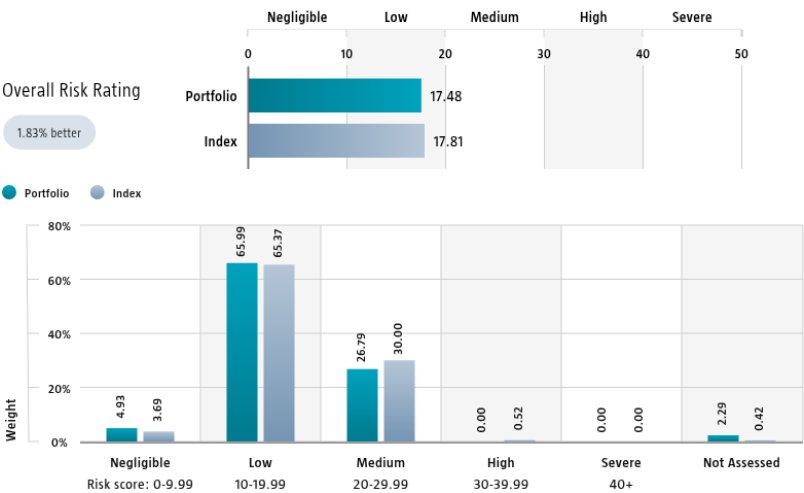

Sustainability

The fund incorporates sustainability in the investment process through exclusions, ESG integration, engagement and voting. The fund does not invest in issuers that are in breach of international norms or where activities have been deemed detrimental to society following Robeco's exclusion policy. Financially material ESG factors are integrated in the bottom-up investment analysis to assess existing and potential ESG risks and opportunities. In the stock selection the fund limits exposure to elevated sustainability risks. The fund targets at least 20% lower carbon footprint compared to the reference index. In addition, where a stock issuer is flagged for breaching international standards in the ongoing monitoring, the issuer will become subject to engagement. Lastly, the fund makes use of shareholder rights and applies proxy voting in accordance with Robeco's proxy voting policy. For more information please visit the sustainability-related disclosures. Sustainalytics ESG Risk Rating

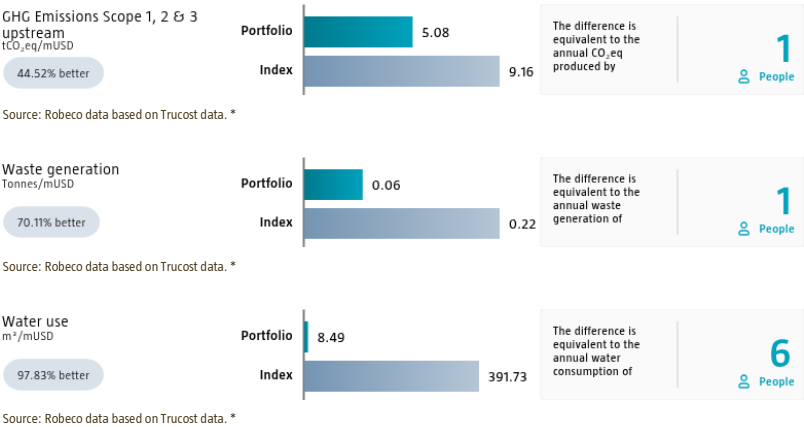
The Portfolio Sustainalytics ESG Risk Rating chart displays the portfolio's ESG Risk Rating. This is calculated by multiplying each portfolio component's Sustainalytics ESG Risk Rating by its respective portfolio weight. The Distribution across Sustainalytics ESG Risk levels chart shows the portfolio allocations broken into Sustainalytics' five ESG risk levels: negligible (0-10), low (10-20), medium (20-30), high (30-40) and severe (40+), providing an overview of portfolio exposure to the different ESG risk levels. 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Environmental Footprint

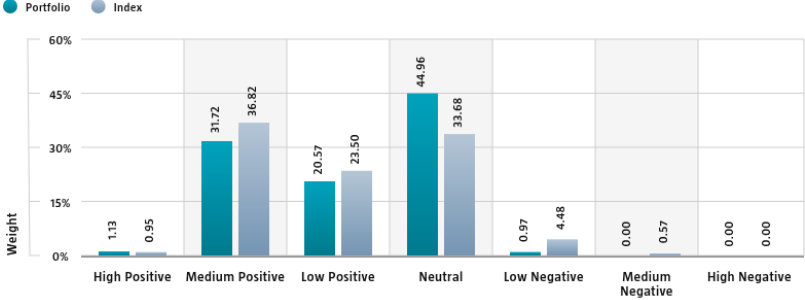
Environmental footprint expresses the total resource consumption of the portfolio per mUSD invested. Each assessed company's footprint is calculated by normalizing resources consumed by the company's enterprise value including cash (EVIC). We aggregate these figures to portfolio level using a weighted average, multiplying each assessed portfolio constituent's footprint by its respective position weight. For comparison, index footprints are shown besides that of the portfolio. The equivalent factors that are used for comparison between the portfolio and index represent European averages and are based on third-party sources combined with own estimates. As such, the figures presented are intended for illustrative purposes and are purely an indication. Only holdings mapped as corporates are included in the figures.



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SDG Impact Alignment

This distribution across SDG scores shows the portfolio weight allocated to companies with a positive, negative and neutral impact alignment with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) based on Robeco’s SDG Framework. The framework utilizes a three-step approach to assess a company’s impact alignment with the relevant SDGs and assign a total SDG score. The score ranges from positive to negative impact alignment with levels from high, medium or low impact alignment. This results in a 7-step scale from -3 to +3. For comparison, index figures are provided alongside that of the portfolio. Only holdings mapped as corporates are included in the figures.

Engagement

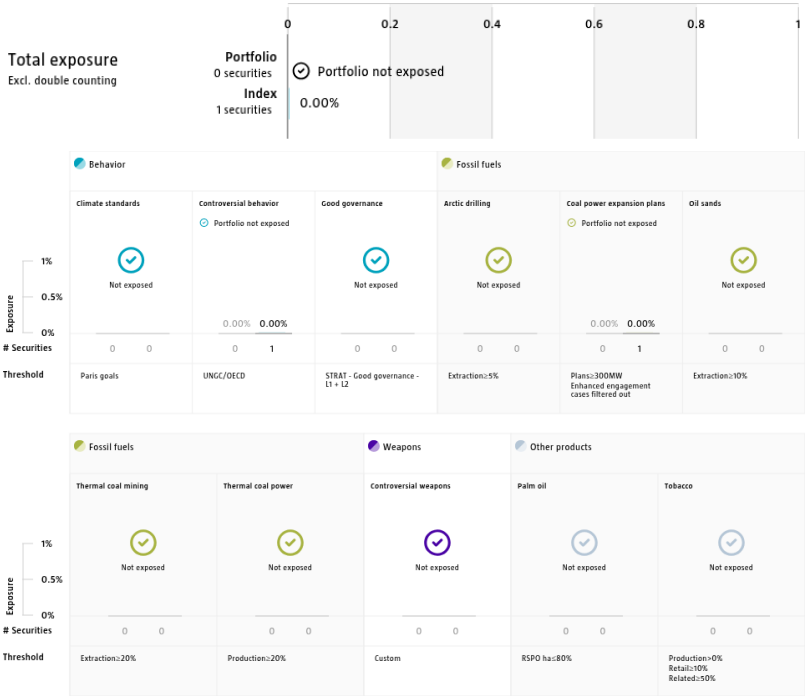
Robeco distinguishes between three types of engagement. Value Engagement focuses on long-term issues that are financially material and/or are causing adverse sustainability impacts. The themes can be broken into Environmental, Social, Governance, or Voting-related. SDG Engagement aims to drive a clear and measurable improvement in a company’s SDG contribution. Enhanced engagement is triggered by misconduct and focuses on companies severely breaching international standards. The report is based on all companies in the portfolio for which engagement activities have taken place during the past 12 months. Note that companies may be under engagement in multiple categories simultaneously. While the total portfolio exposure excludes double counting, it may not equal the sum of individual category exposures.

The fund invests in companies in the financial sector with a focus on attractive long-term growth trends, such as digitization of financial services, aging finance to retire comfortably and increasing penetration of financial services in emerging markets. The fund's objective is to achieve a better return than the Benchmark.

The fund promotes E&S (i.e. Environmental and Social) characteristics within the meaning of Article 8 of the European Sustainable Finance Disclosure Regulation, integrates sustainability risks in the investment process and applies Robeco's Good Governance policy. The fund applies sustainability indicators, including but not limited to, normative, activity-based and region-based exclusions, proxy voting and engagement.

Prior to joining Robeco in 2008, he managed the ABN AMRO Financials fund from October 2003 to December 2007. Patrick Lemmens started his career in the investment industry in 1993. He holds a Master's in Business Economics from Erasmus University Rotterdam and is a Certified European Financial Analyst. In 2020, Michiel rejoined Robeco from Union Bancaire Privée in Hong Kong where he was CIO Asian Equities. Prior to that, Michiel spent 12 years at Robeco in several senior positions including portfolio manager Rolinco Global Growth fund and Robeco Asian Stars. Prior to joining Robeco in 2005, Michiel was Portfolio Manager US Equity at PGGM and Economist with Rabobank Netherlands. Michiel started his career in the investment industry in 1996. Michiel van Voorst holds a Master's in Economics from University of Utrecht and is a CFA® Charterholder. Koos Burema is Co-Portfolio Manager and member of the Thematic Investing team. He has a focus on financials/fintech. Koos was an Analyst with the Emerging Markets team covering Korea and technology in Taiwan and Mainland China. Besides this, he was responsible for the integration of ESG in the investment process. Before joining the team in January 2010, he worked as a Portfolio Manager for different sector teams within Robeco. He started his career in the industry in 2007. Koos holds a Master's in Business Administration from the University of Groningen and is a CFA® charterholder.

Fiscal product treatment

The fund is established in Luxembourg and is subject to the Luxembourg tax laws and regulations. The fund is not liable to pay any corporation, income, dividend or capital gains tax in Luxembourg. The fund is subject to an annual subscription tax ('tax d'abonnement') in Luxembourg, which amounts to 0.05% of the net asset value of the fund. This tax is included in the net asset value of the fund. The fund can in principle use the Luxembourg treaty network to partially recover any withholding tax on its income.

Fiscal treatment of investor

The fiscal consequences of investing in this fund depend on the investor's personal situation. For private investors in the Netherlands real interest and dividend income or capital gains received on their investments are not relevant for tax purposes. Each year investors pay income tax on the value of their net assets as at 1 January if and inasmuch as such net assets exceed the investor's tax-free allowance.
