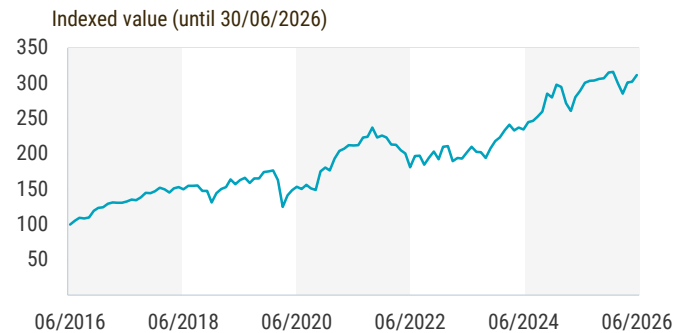

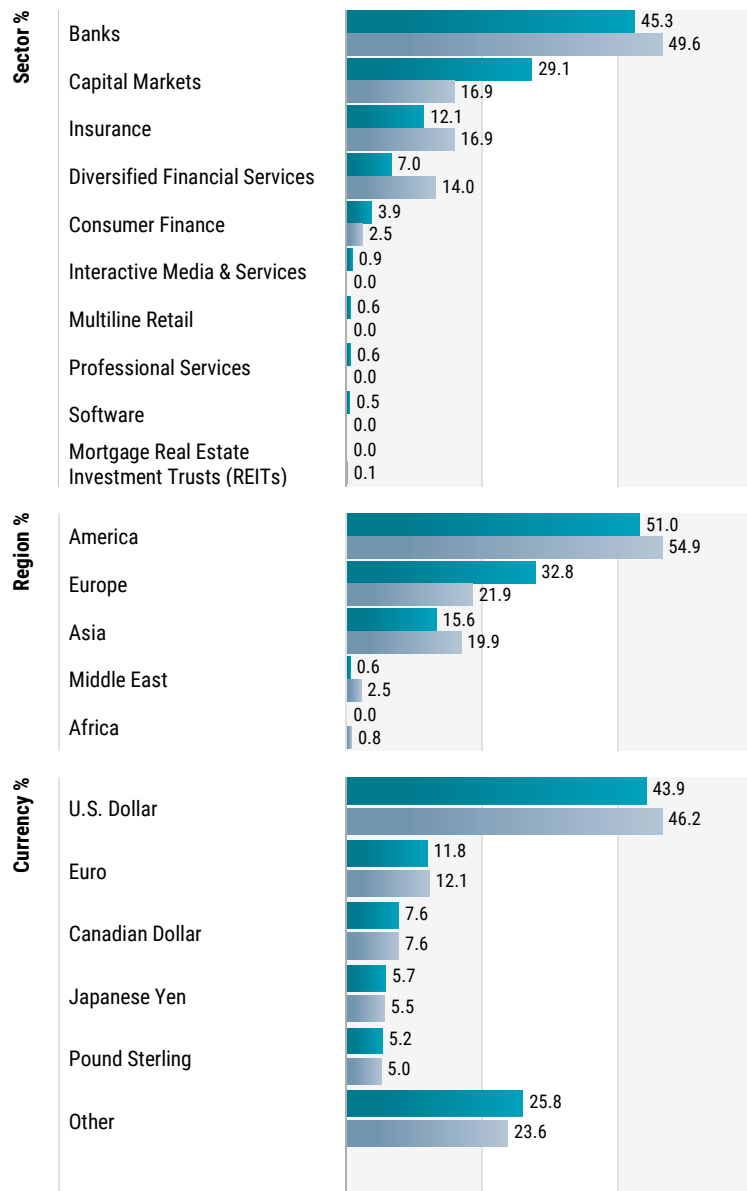

Performance commentary

Based on transaction prices, the fund's return was 3.18%.

Robeco New World Financials underperformed versus the benchmark during June, with Aging Finance contributing positively to performance, while Emerging Finance and Digital Finance detracted. Performance was driven by strong contributions from bank and consumer finance holdings, with U.S. Bancorp, Citizens Financial Group, Citigroup, Erste Bank and Capital One Financial among the strongest performers. Supportive regulatory developments, robust capital markets activity and favorable credit trends provided a tailwind for financial institutions. On the other hand, Digital Finance and Emerging Finance weighed on returns. Coinbase, Intercontinental Exchange and AIA Group were among the largest detractors. At the industry level, banks and consumer finance contributed positively, while insurance and capital markets detracted from performance during the month.

Market development

Although broader equity markets faced headwinds from higher interest rate concerns and geopolitical uncertainty, financial stocks outperformed. Financials outperformed global equities as the macroeconomic backdrop and robust capital market activity remained supportive for the sector. Economic data continued to point to resilient growth, while fading recession concerns and easing geopolitical tensions improved risk appetite. At the same time, expectations for interest rates to remain relatively elevated supported banks' net interest income, while a steepening yield curve improved earnings prospects for lenders. Investors also rotated toward cyclical and value-oriented sectors as market leadership broadened beyond technology, providing an additional tailwind for financial stocks.

Expectation of fund manager

We remain positive on the outlook for financials. A steepening yield curve, easing monetary conditions and a more supportive regulatory environment are creating favorable conditions for banks and other financial institutions. Within Aging Finance, structural trends such as retirement savings growth, expanding alternative asset management and a healthy pipeline of M&A and IPO activity continue to support long-term growth. Emerging Finance benefits from low financial penetration, attractive valuations and supportive economic conditions across many emerging markets. In Digital Finance, opportunities remain strongest in digital payments, FinTech lending, artificial intelligence and blockchain-based financial infrastructure, where innovation continues to drive market share gains and long-term growth potential.

Top 10 largest holdings

Top overweights in May were US Bancorp, Capital One Financial, Ameriprise, Aegon and Standard Chartered.

Sector allocation

The three main trends in the fund are Emerging, Digital and Aging Finance. Emerging Finance is about emerging-market growth, but also includes innovative financials in developed markets. Digital Finance is about the increasing digitization of the sector. Aging Finance is about building up enough savings to enter retirement comfortably. As we look top-down at trends and bottom-up at stock selection, regional or sector spreads are merely the result of the investment process, though we do monitor limits.

Regional allocation

Robeco New World Financials selects the long-term trends that are expected to show the most powerful growth over the long term. Within the trends, the fund managers select the companies that will best capitalize on long-term trend growth. How much we invest depends on the stock valuation, where we look for growth at a reasonable price. As we look top-down at trends and bottom-up at stock selection, regional or sector spreads are merely the result of the investment process, though we do monitor limits.

Currency allocation

The fund takes small active currency positions, but generally hedges back to the benchmark. We do not hedge currency exposures in emerging markets, as this is costly. This leads to a small USD balance.

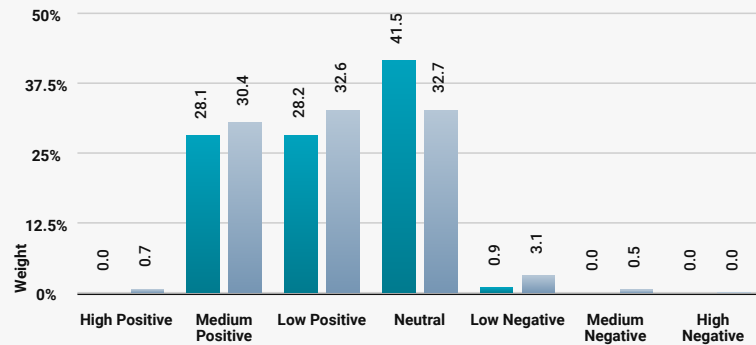

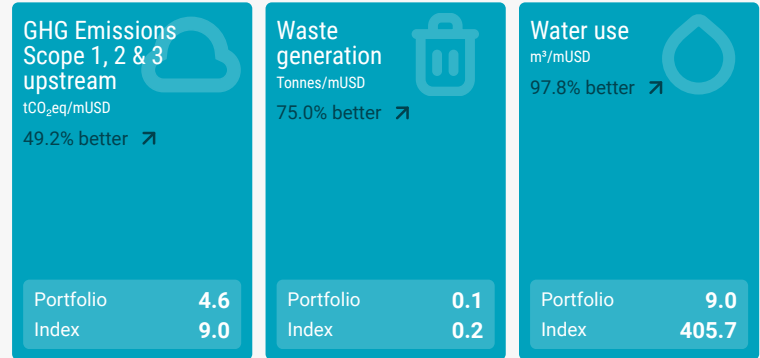
SDG Impact Alignment ¹

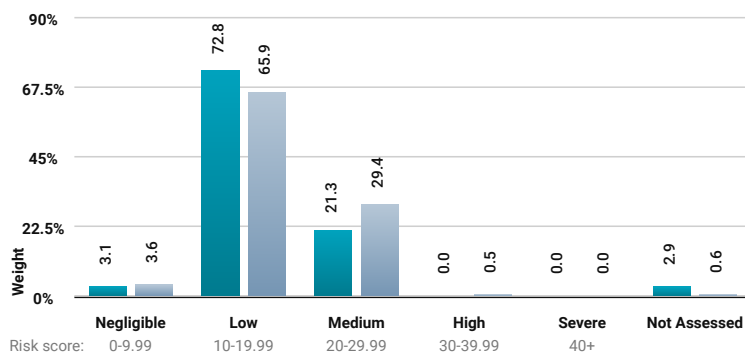
Sustainalytics ESG Risk Rating ³

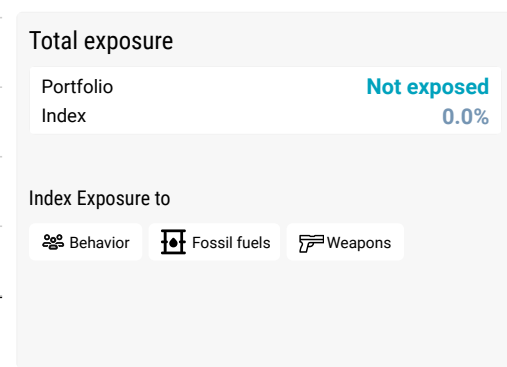

1. SDG Impact Alignment

This distribution across SDG scores shows the portfolio weight allocated to companies with a positive, negative and neutral impact alignment with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) based on Robeco's SDG Framework. The framework utilizes a three-step approach to assess a company's impact alignment with the relevant SDGs and assign a total SDG score. The score ranges from positive to negative impact alignment with levels from high, medium or low impact alignment. Only holdings mapped as corporates are included in the figures.

2. Environmental Footprint

Environmental footprint expresses the total resource consumption of the portfolio per mUSD invested. Each assessed company's footprint is calculated by normalizing resources consumed by the company's enterprise value including cash (EVIC). We aggregate these figures to portfolio level using a weighted average, multiplying each assessed portfolio constituent's footprint by its respective position weight. The equivalent factors that are used for comparison between the portfolio and index (where applicable) represent European averages and are based on third-party sources combined with own estimates. As such, the figures presented are intended for illustrative purposes and are purely an indication. Only holdings mapped as corporates are included in the figures.

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3. Sustainalytics ESG Risk Rating

The chart displays the portfolio's Sustainalytics ESG Risk Rating. This is calculated by multiplying each portfolio component's Sustainalytics ESG Risk Rating by its respective portfolio weight. The distribution across Sustainalytics ESG Risk levels chart shows the portfolio allocations broken into Sustainalytics' five ESG risk levels: negligible (0-10), low (10-20), medium (20-30), high (30-40) and severe (40+), providing an overview of portfolio exposure to the different ESG risk levels. Only holdings mapped as corporates are included in the figures.

4. Exclusions

5. Engagement

Robeco distinguishes between three types of engagement. Value Engagement focuses on long-term issues that are financially material and/or are causing adverse sustainability impacts. The themes can be broken into Environmental, Social, Governance, or Voting-related. SDG Engagement aims to drive a clear and measurable improvement in a company's SDG contribution. Enhanced engagement is triggered by misconduct and focuses on companies severely breaching international standards. The report is based on all companies in the portfolio for which engagement activities have taken place during the past 12 months. Note that companies may be under engagement in multiple categories simultaneously. While the total portfolio exposure excludes double counting, it may not equal the sum of individual category exposures.

Risk management

Risk management is fully integrated into the investment process to ensure that positions always meet predefined guidelines.

Fiscal product treatment

The fund is established in Luxembourg and is subject to the Luxembourg tax laws and regulations. The fund is not liable to pay any corporation, income, dividend or capital gains tax in Luxembourg. The fund is subject to an annual subscription tax ('tax d'abonnement') in Luxembourg, which amounts to 0.05% of the net asset value of the fund. This tax is included in the net asset value of the fund. The fund can in principle use the Luxembourg treaty network to partially recover any withholding tax on its income.

Fiscal treatment of investor

The fiscal consequences of investing in this fund depend on the investor's personal situation. For private investors in the Netherlands real interest and dividend income or capital gains received on their investments are not relevant for tax purposes. Each year investors pay income tax on the value of their net assets as at 1 January if and inasmuch as such net assets exceed the investor's tax-free allowance. Any amount invested in the fund forms part of the investor's net assets. Private investors who are resident outside the Netherlands will not be taxed in the Netherlands on their investments in the fund. However, such investors may be taxed in their country of residence on any income from an investment in this fund based on the applicable national fiscal laws. Other fiscal rules apply to legal entities or professional investors. We advise investors to consult their financial or tax adviser about the tax consequences of an investment in this fund in their specific circumstances before deciding to invest in the fund.

Dividend policy

The fund does not distribute dividend. Any income earned is retained, and so the fund's entire performance is reflected in its share price.
