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Performance commentary

Based on transaction prices, the fund's return was 11.05%.

Robeco Digital Innovations delivered a very strong May, significantly outperforming the MSCI ACWI amid broad-based gains across most segments. Performance dispersion remained elevated, with Security and Software emerging as standout contributors, while Health Innovation lagged. Security (+60.2%) was the key driver, as cybersecurity stocks sharply re-rated following strong earnings, with all holdings posting gains above 50%. Software (+24.7%) also rebounded strongly after a prolonged period of weakness, supported by better-than-expected results from names such as Datadog, Snowflake and ServiceNow. Digital Infrastructure (+10.8%) benefited from continued strength in memory semiconductors, notably Micron and SK hynix, reflecting persistent supply tightness and rising pricing. Artificial Intelligence (+7.7%), Robotics & Automation (+10.2%) and Frontier Technologies (+22.0%) all contributed positively, supported by ongoing AI-driven demand and improving sentiment. In contrast, Health Innovation (-2.6%) remained under pressure despite solid underlying results. Top contributors included Palo Alto Networks, TSMC and Datadog, while Intuitive Surgical and Intuit detracted.

Market development

Global equity markets extended their gains in May 2026, supported by strong AI-driven momentum and another robust earnings season, with US indices reaching new record highs and technology stocks leading the advance. Corporate fundamentals remained a key pillar of market strength, as 85% of S&P 500 companies reported earnings above expectations while 81% exceeded revenue forecasts. First-quarter earnings growth surprised significantly to the upside, rising to 28.6% year-on-year – more than double the initial expectations at the start of the reporting season. The technology sector continued to dominate performance, driven by exceptional demand for AI-related infrastructure. In particular, semiconductors and software stocks benefited most, as investors increasingly priced in sustained growth supported by structural AI adoption and ongoing digital transformation trends.

Expectation of fund manager

The pace of global innovation is accelerating across diverse fields such as quantum computing, nuclear fusion, and drug discovery. As noted by economist Robert Solow, new ideas are the essential engine for sustained economic growth, ensuring that despite macroeconomic fluctuations, the direction of technological progress remains inexorably forward. In 2025, artificial intelligence served as the primary driver for both innovation and earnings growth for the third consecutive year – a trend projected to persist through 2026. Furthermore, AI is expanding into the physical realm through connected robotic systems. This shift coincides with a renewed interest in reshoring manufacturing to address labor shortages and geopolitical risks. In the US, investment in manufacturing facilities has surged threefold over four years. However, this digital transformation also expands the cyber threat landscape, as both security systems and bad actors leverage AI. While the long-term outlook for these high-growth themes remains positive, the primary near-term risk involves meeting the high market expectations following three years of exceptional performance.

Top 10 largest holdings

The top five largest positions for the month are NVIDIA, TSMC, Microsoft, Alphabet and Amazon.

Sector allocation

We have selected seven innovations to segment the portfolio: AI, Robotics & Automation, Software, Security, Digital Infrastructure, Health Innovation and Frontier Technologies. The sector positioning is the outcome of our bottom-up stock selection process within these trends.

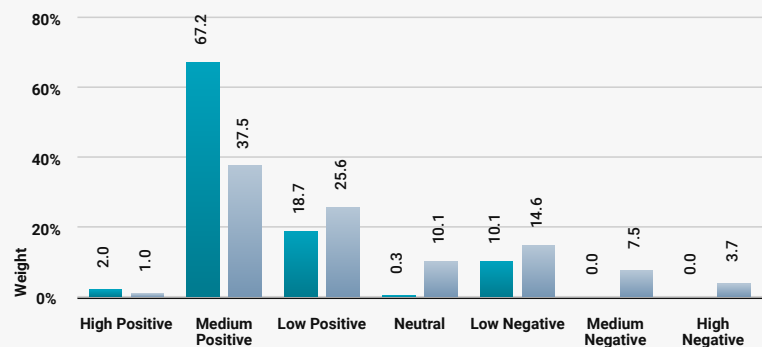

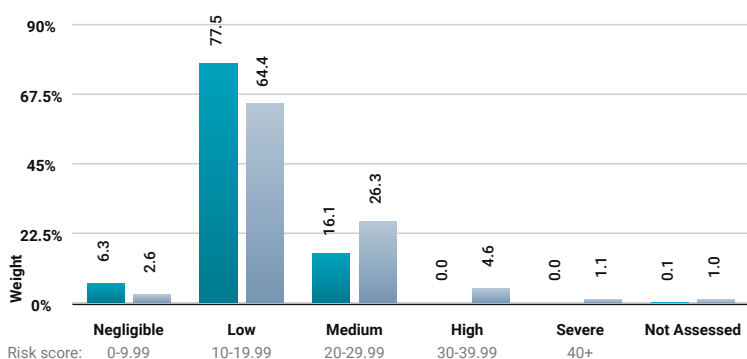

1. SDG Impact Alignment

This distribution across SDG scores shows the portfolio weight allocated to companies with a positive, negative and neutral impact alignment with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) based on Robeco's SDG Framework. The framework utilizes a three-step approach to assess a company's impact alignment with the relevant SDGs and assign a total SDG score. The score ranges from positive to negative impact alignment with levels from high, medium or low impact alignment. Only holdings mapped as corporates are included in the figures.

2. Environmental Footprint

Environmental footprint expresses the total resource consumption of the portfolio per mUSD invested. Each assessed company's footprint is calculated by normalizing resources consumed by the company's enterprise value including cash (EVIC). We aggregate these figures to portfolio level using a weighted average, multiplying each assessed portfolio constituent's footprint by its respective position weight. The equivalent factors that are used for comparison between the portfolio and index (where applicable) represent European averages and are based on third-party sources combined with own estimates. As such, the figures presented are intended for illustrative purposes and are purely an indication. Only holdings mapped as corporates are included in the figures.

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3. Sustainalytics ESG Risk Rating

The chart displays the portfolio's Sustainalytics ESG Risk Rating. This is calculated by multiplying each portfolio component's Sustainalytics ESG Risk Rating by its respective portfolio weight. The distribution across Sustainalytics ESG Risk levels chart shows the portfolio allocations broken into Sustainalytics' five ESG risk levels: negligible (0-10), low (10-20), medium (20-30), high (30-40) and severe (40+), providing an overview of portfolio exposure to the different ESG risk levels.

5. Engagement

Robeco distinguishes between three types of engagement. Value Engagement focuses on long-term issues that are financially material and/or are causing adverse sustainability impacts. The themes can be broken into Environmental, Social, Governance, or Voting-related. SDG Engagement aims to drive a clear and measurable improvement in a company's SDG contribution. Enhanced engagement is triggered by misconduct and focuses on companies severely breaching international standards. The report is based on all companies in the portfolio for which engagement activities have taken place during the past 12 months. Note that companies may be under engagement in multiple categories simultaneously. While the total portfolio exposure excludes double counting, it may not equal the sum of individual category exposures.

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Risk management

Risk management is fully integrated into the investment process to ensure that positions always meet predefined guidelines.

Fiscal product treatment

The fund is established in Luxembourg and is subject to the Luxembourg tax laws and regulations. The fund is not liable to pay any corporation, income, dividend or capital gains tax in Luxembourg. The fund is subject to an annual subscription tax ('tax d'abonnement') in Luxembourg, which amounts to 0.05% of the net asset value of the fund. This tax is included in the net asset value of the fund. The fund can in principle use the Luxembourg treaty network to partially recover any withholding tax on its income.

Dividend policy

The fund does not distribute dividend. The fund retains any income that is earned, and so its entire performance is reflected in the price.
