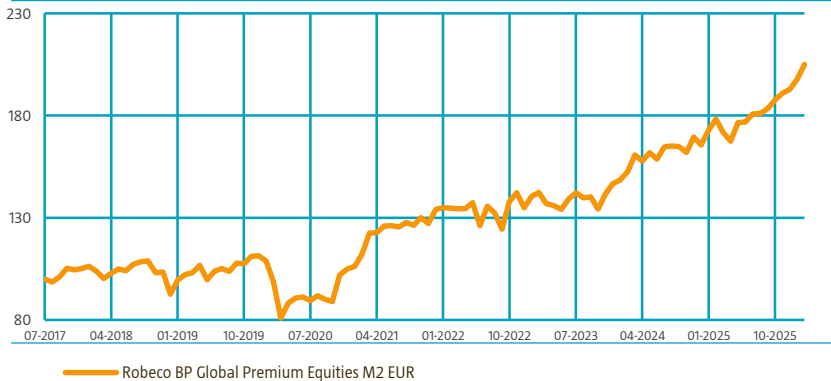

Performance

Based on transaction prices, the fund's return was 3.68%.

Robeco BP Global Premium Equities strongly outpaced the MSCI World Index in February, with sector allocation driving relative returns while stock selection contributed to a lesser extent. Sector allocation contributed to relative returns across the majority of sectors. Underweight exposure to information technology, consumer discretionary and communication services, and overweight exposure to industrials, energy and consumer staples added most value during the month. Stock selection was strong in the sectors of communication services and consumer discretionary, only to be partially offset by picks in the information technology and materials sectors. In communication services, Deutsche Telekom shares rose over 20% due to a combination of strong 2025 earnings and a confident outlook for 2026. Avoiding Alphabet and Meta Platforms was beneficial, as the stocks fell 8% and 10%, respectively. Within consumer discretionary, Suzuki Motor shares were higher by 11%, and not owning Amazon and Tesla also meaningfully contributed to relative returns.

Market development

Global equities were mostly positive in February, particularly in non-US developed markets. Investors continued to rotate out of high-flying US tech names and into other areas of the equity markets, including value stocks and overseas securities. The macroeconomic backdrop remained generally supportive, with stable growth and moderate levels of inflation. The US dollar rose during the month on higher-than-expected US producer price data.

Expectation of fund manager

Conflict in the Middle East adds to the already considerable geopolitical risk this year. And while the current global state of affairs is unsettling and volatility has increased, history suggests that events such as these have not necessarily led to a collapse in stock prices. Meanwhile, the growing divergence in performance between growth and value stocks is leading to a broader range of outcomes among sectors and securities, which is fertile ground for active, value-focused managers such as us.

Top 10 largest positions

IMI, AIB Group and Capgemini exit the top ten, and are replaced by SPIE, Tesco and LabCorp Holdings.

Mr. Jones is a Portfolio Manager of the Boston Partners Global Equity, Boston Partners Global Long/Short Equity, and Boston Partners International Equity strategies, with primary responsibility for managing the firm's International Equity and Global Long/Short Equity offerings. Prior to this role, he was a research analyst specializing in the energy and metals and mining sectors of the equity market and was a global generalist. Mr. Jones joined the firm in January 2006 from Cambridge Associates where he was a consulting associate focused on hedge fund clients. He holds a B.A. in Economics from Bowdoin College and the Chartered Financial Analyst® designation. Mr. Jones began his career in the investment industry in 2004. Mr. Hart is a Portfolio Manager of the Boston Partners Global Equity and Boston Partners International Equity strategies, with primary responsibility for managing the firm's Global Equity long portfolios. Prior to this, he was the portfolio manager of the Boston Partners International Small Cap Value product and, before that, an assistant portfolio manager of the Boston Partners Small Cap Value products for three years. Previously, he was a research analyst specializing in the conglomerates, engineering and construction, building, machinery, aerospace & defense, and REITs sectors of the equity market. Mr. Hart holds a B.S. in Finance with a concentration in Corporate Finance from Clemson University and the Chartered Financial Analyst® designation. Mr. Song is an Assistant Portfolio Manager of the Boston Partners Global Equity and Boston Partners International Equity strategies as well as the lead Portfolio Manager of the Boston Partners Global Sustainability strategy. He also serves as an equity analyst, specializing in developed non-U.S. industrials, materials, and transportation sectors of the equity market. Before joining Boston Partners in April 2019, he was a managing director at ThornTree Capital with responsibility for its global industrials long/short portfolio. Prior to that, Mr. Song was a managing director at Bain Capital's Brookside Fund where he co-managed its global industrials long/short portfolio. He began his investing career at Bain Capital in its North American private equity practice. Before transitioning to a career in investments, he was a consultant at McKinsey & Company. Mr. Song earned an M.B.A. from Harvard Business School, an M.Sc. in Clinical Medicine from Oxford University, and an A.B. in Biochemical Sciences from Harvard College, where he graduated summa cum laude. Mr. Song began his career in the investment industry in 2005.
