

## Robeco High Yield Bonds OEH EUR

Robeco High Yield Bonds is an actively managed fund that invests predominantly in bonds with a sub-investment grade rating, issued primarily by issuers from developed markets (Europe/US). The selection of these bonds is based on fundamental analysis. The fund's objective is to provide long-term capital growth. The portfolio is broadly diversified, with a structural bias towards the higher rated part in high yield. Performance drivers are the top-down beta positioning as well as bottom-up issuer selection.

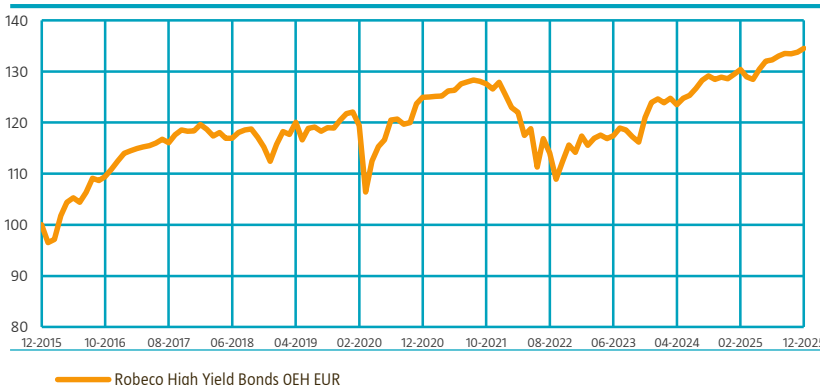

### Performance

Based on transaction prices, the fund's return was 0.53%.

In December, the high yield market had a total return of 0.36%. Quite strong credit excess returns were partly offset by the underlying government rates widening over the month, as the 10-year US Treasury yield climbed 10 bps to 4.17 per cent. The portfolio outperformed by 12 bps this month, as issuer selection contributed 15 bps and underweight beta positioning detracted 3 bps. Overall, the euro high yield market outperformed on a risk-adjusted basis, benefiting our positioning. Also, our allocation to BBs and Bs, in both currency denominations, contributed positively to performance. Underweight in the communications sector added 6 bps and overweight in the capital goods sector added 3 bps. The underweight position in Warner Bros Discovery bonds detracted 4 bps, as the bidding war between Paramount and Netflix appeared to favor Netflix, increasing the likelihood of a split of the linear business, a scenario viewed as unfavorable for bondholders. The overweight position in Ineos Quattro detracted 3 bps, as persistent weakness in the company's chemicals end markets continued to exert pressure on its bonds.

### Market development

In December, high yield spreads tightened by 3 bps to 273, while YTW compressed by 2 bps to 6.25%. In December, US economic data continued to send mixed signals. The economy grew at a strong annualized pace of 4.3% in Q3, well above expectations driven primarily by resilient consumer spending on healthcare and computing, alongside higher defense outlays and exports. Despite this strength, consumer confidence deteriorated sharply, falling to its lowest level in five years. The year-long theme of a bifurcated economy became more pronounced, with nearly half of total consumer spending now coming from the top 10% of earners, while the bottom 80% accounted for just 37%, highlighting growing reliance on higher-income households amid softer labor market conditions. Inflation remained above target, with core PCE running at 2.8%. The Fed cut rates by 25 bps at its December meeting, and expectations for further easing in the new year weighed on the dollar. Over 2025, the dollar depreciated by 9.5% against a basket of major currencies. US high yield new issuance totaled USD 22 bln, while default/distressed exchanges activity was elevated with USD 5.1 bln in bonds involved.

### Expectation of fund manager

The fourth quarter of 2025 ended positively for credit investors, with high yield delivering excess returns, though the lowest-rated credits underperformed, highlighting the need for selectivity. Looking to 2026, global growth prospects are strong. In the US, the average consumer remains resilient despite ongoing disparities, with lower-income groups and small businesses facing more challenges. The AI investment surge, reduced tariff uncertainty, and continued monetary easing are expected to support US economic growth, with consensus forecasting 2% real GDP growth. While the labor market poses some risks, recession fears have eased and a reacceleration is possible. US inflation is above target but manageable, aided by cooling services inflation and lower oil prices. The Fed must balance growth, inflation, and a potentially softer labor market. In Europe, rates support the economy, but growth is expected to be modest. Uncertainty from new AI sector supply and M&A activity clouds the 2026 outlook. Valuations are tight, so we remain conservative, focusing on quality and risk management.

### Top 10 largest positions

Our largest positions are concentrated in the chemicals, automotive and packaging segments, alongside select exposures in leisure, energy and mining. In chemicals, we hold a significant position in Olympus Water. Within automotive, ZF Industries remains one of our key holdings. We also maintain a sizable allocation to Carnival Corporation in leisure and to Venture Global LNG within energy midstream. In mining, Fortescue represents a notable position. Across packaging, our core exposures include Crown Holdings, Ardagh Group and Graphic Packaging.

### Changes

The benchmark of the fund is Bloomberg Barclays US Corp. HY & Pan Eur. HY ex Fin. 2,5% issuer Cap (hedged into EUR). The fund aims to outperform by taking positions that deviate from the benchmark within predefined risk limits. This share class of the fund hedged the interest rate duration until 10 December 2019 to nearly zero, therefore the benchmark of the fund was not representative. Since 11 December 2019, the duration hedge was removed and the benchmark is representative to compare the fund performance.

### Sector allocation

The fund maintains overweights in less cyclical areas such as packaging and paper, complemented by an outspoken off-benchmark position in financials. We also carry additional overweights in chemicals, automotive and food & beverage. On the other hand, we remain underweight in the communications sector, as well as more cyclical consumer-oriented areas including gaming, retail, home construction and leisure.

Most exposure is in Ba and B issuers. The fund has a large underweight in the categories Caa and below. We have an allocation to BBBs, mainly consisting of former rising stars that still trade at attractive spread levels, as well as positions lower in the capital structure of European banks.

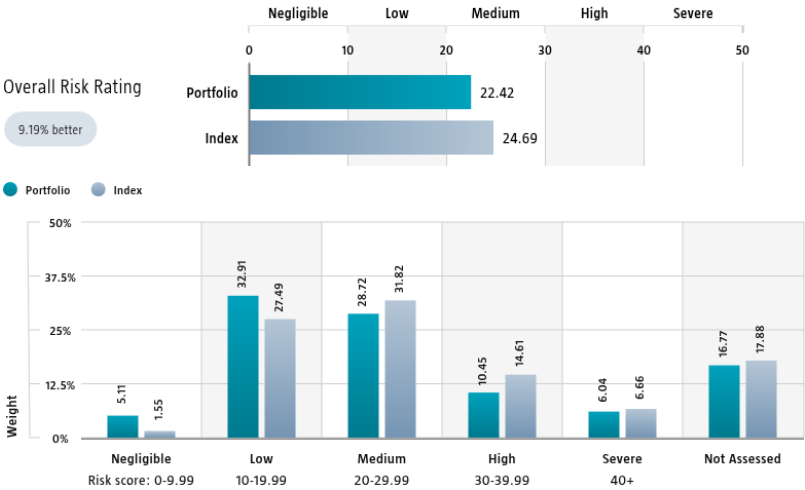

Sustainability

The fund incorporates sustainability in the investment process via exclusions, ESG integration, a minimum allocation to ESG-labeled bonds, and engagement. The fund does not invest in credit issuers that are in breach of international norms or where activities have been deemed detrimental to society following Robeco's exclusion policy. Financially material ESG factors are integrated in the bottom-up security analysis to assess the impact on the issuer's fundamental credit quality. In the credit selection the fund limits exposure to issuers with an elevated sustainability risk profile. Furthermore, the fund invests at least 2% in green, social, sustainable, and/or sustainability-linked bonds. Lastly, where issuers are flagged for breaching international standards in the ongoing monitoring, the issuer will become subject to engagement. Sustainalytics ESG Risk Rating

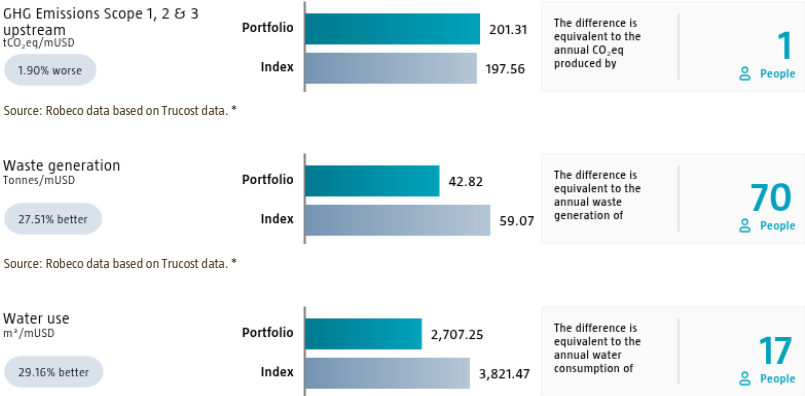
The Portfolio Sustainalytics ESG Risk Rating chart displays the portfolio's ESG Risk Rating. This is calculated by multiplying each portfolio component's Sustainalytics ESG Risk Rating by its respective portfolio weight. The Distribution across Sustainalytics ESG Risk levels chart shows the portfolio allocations broken into Sustainalytics' five ESG risk levels: negligible (0-10), low (10-20), medium (20-30), high (30-40) and severe (40+), providing an overview of portfolio exposure to the different ESG risk levels. Index scores are provided alongside the portfolio scores, highlighting the portfolio's ESG risk level compared to the index. Only holdings mapped as corporates are included in the figures.



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Environmental Footprint

Environmental footprint expresses the total resource consumption of the portfolio per mUSD invested. Each assessed company's footprint is calculated by normalizing resources consumed by the company's enterprise value including cash (EVIC). We aggregate these figures to portfolio level using a weighted average, multiplying each assessed portfolio constituent's footprint by its respective position weight. For comparison, index footprints are shown besides that of the portfolio. The equivalent factors that are used for comparison between the portfolio and index represent European averages and are based on third-party sources combined with own estimates. As such, the figures presented are intended for illustrative purposes and are purely an indication. Only holdings mapped as corporates are included in the figures.

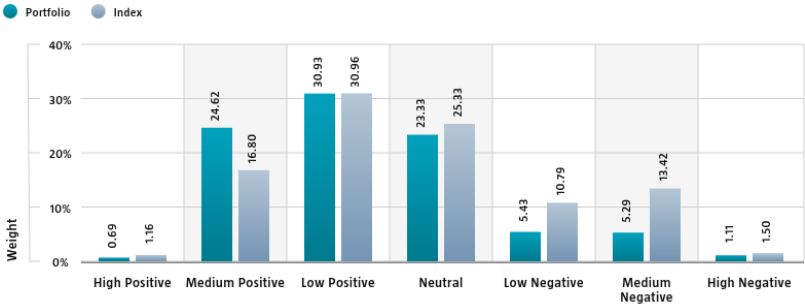

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SDG Impact Alignment

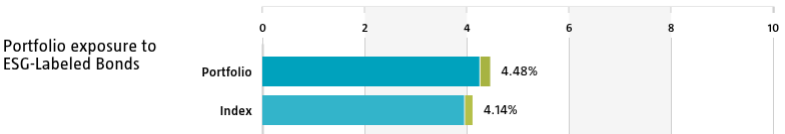
This distribution across SDG scores shows the portfolio weight allocated to companies with a positive, negative and neutral impact alignment with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) based on Robeco’s SDG Framework. The framework utilizes a three-step approach to assess a company’s impact alignment with the relevant SDGs and assign a total SDG score. The score ranges from positive to negative impact alignment with levels from high, medium or low impact alignment. This results in a 7-step scale from -3 to +3. Engagement

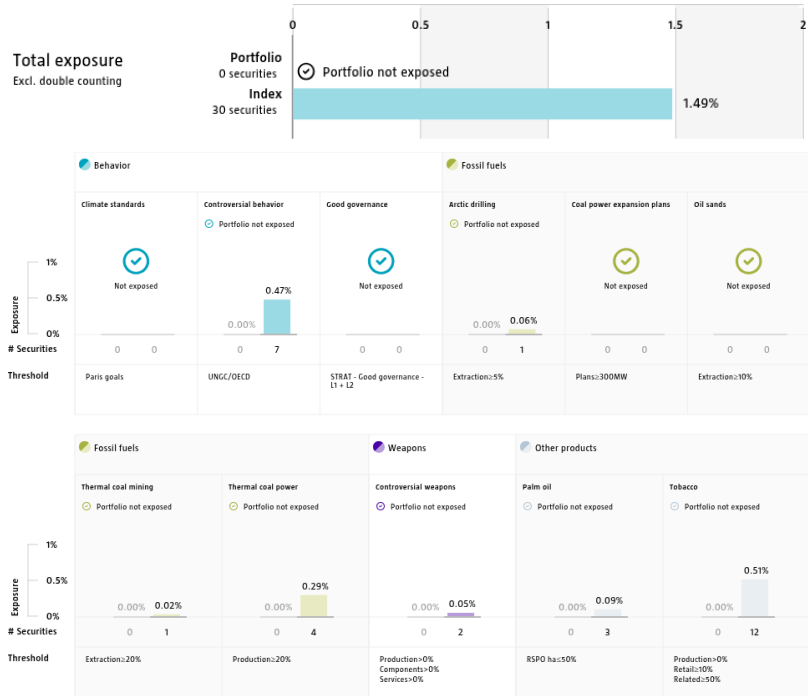
Robeco distinguishes between three types of engagement. Value Engagement focuses on long-term issues that are financially material and/or are causing adverse sustainability impacts. The themes can be broken into Environmental, Social, Governance, or Voting-related. SDG Engagement aims to drive a clear and measurable improvement in a company’s SDG contribution. Enhanced engagement is triggered by misconduct and focuses on companies severely breaching international standards. The report is based on all companies in the portfolio for which engagement activities have taken place during the past 12 months. Note that companies may be under engagement in multiple categories simultaneously. While the total portfolio exposure excludes double counting, it may not equal the sum of individual category exposures.

Robeco High Yield Bonds is an actively managed fund that invests predominantly in bonds with a sub-investment grade rating, issued primarily by issuers from developed markets (Europe/US). The selection of these bonds is based on fundamental analysis. The fund's objective is to provide long-term capital growth. The portfolio is broadly diversified, with a structural bias towards the higher rated part in high yield. Performance drivers are the top-down beta positioning as well as bottom-up issuer selection. The fund promotes E&S (i.e. Environmental and Social) characteristics within the meaning of Article 8 of the European Sustainable Finance Disclosure Regulation, integrates sustainability risks in the investment process and applies Robeco's Good Governance policy. The fund applies sustainability indicators, including but not limited to, normative, activity-based and region-based exclusions, and engagement.

### Fund manager's CV

Sander Bus is CIO and Portfolio Manager High Yield Bonds in the Credit team. He has been dedicated to High Yield at Robeco since 1998. Previously, Sander worked for two years as a Fixed Income Analyst at Rabobank where he started his career in the industry in 1996. He holds a Master's in Financial Economics from Erasmus University Rotterdam and he is a CFA® charterholder. Roeland Moraal is Portfolio Manager High Yield in the Credit team. Before assuming this role, he was Portfolio Manager in the Robeco Duration team and worked as an Analyst with the Institute for Research and Investment Services. Roeland started his career in the industry in 1997. He holds a Master's in Applied Mathematics from the University of Twente and a Master's in Law from Erasmus University Rotterdam. Christiaan Lever is Portfolio Manager High Yield and Emerging Credits in the Credit team. Before assuming this role in 2016, he was Financial Risk Manager at Robeco, focusing on market risk, counterparty risk and liquidity risk within fixed Income markets. Christiaan has been active in the industry since 2010. He holds a Master's in Quantitative Finance and in Econometrics from Erasmus University Rotterdam and he is a CFA® Charterholder. Daniel de Koning is Portfolio Manager High Yield in the Credit team. Prior to joining Robeco in 2020, he was Portfolio Manager High Yield at NN Investment Partners. Daniel started his career in 2011 at APG Asset Management, where he held roles of Credit Analyst and Portfolio Manager High Yield. He holds a Master's in Business Economics from the University of Amsterdam and he is a CFA® and CAIA® charterholder.

### Team info

The Robeco High Yield fund is managed within Robeco's credit team, which consists of nine portfolio managers and twenty-three credit analysts. The portfolio managers are responsible for the construction and management of the credit portfolios, whereas the analysts cover the team's fundamental research. Our analysts have long term experience in their respective sectors which they cover globally. Each analyst covers both investment grade and high yield, providing them an information advantage and benefiting from inefficiencies that traditionally exist between the two segmented markets. Furthermore, the credit team is supported by three dedicated quantitative researchers and four fixed income traders. On average, the members of the credit team have an experience in the asset management industry of seventeen years, of which eight years with Robeco.

### Fiscal product treatment

The fund is established in Luxembourg and is subject to the Luxembourg tax laws and regulations. The fund is not liable to pay any corporation, income, dividend or capital gains tax in Luxembourg. The fund is subject to an annual subscription tax ('tax d'abonnement') in Luxembourg, which amounts to 0.05% of the net asset value of the fund. This tax is included in the net asset value of the fund. The fund can in principle use the Luxembourg treaty network to partially recover any withholding tax on its income.

### Fiscal treatment of investor

The fiscal consequences of investing in this fund depend on the investor's personal situation. For private investors in the Netherlands real interest and dividend income or capital gains received on their investments are not relevant for tax purposes. Each year investors pay income tax on the value of their net assets as at 1 January if and inasmuch as such net assets exceed the investor's tax-free allowance. Any amount invested in the fund forms part of the investor's net assets. Private investors who are resident outside the Netherlands will not be taxed in the Netherlands on their investments in the fund. However, such investors may be taxed in their country of residence on any income from an investment in this fund based on the applicable national fiscal laws. Other fiscal rules apply to legal entities or professional investors. We advise investors to consult their financial or tax adviser about the tax consequences of an investment in this fund in their specific circumstances before deciding to invest in the fund.
