Performance

Based on transaction prices, the fund's return was 0.98%.

Underweights in Hong Kong and China detracted from performance, while underweights in Indonesia contributed. Overweights in the technology and banking sectors contributed to performance, while the combined underweight in sovereign issuers and state-owned enterprises also contributed to performance.

Market development

Asian credit markets navigated February 2026 with strong technicals and lower primary supply due to Lunar Year holidays. Investment grade spreads widened around 8 bps, with high yield spreads 17 bps. Supply was easily absorbed as investors sought safe-haven assets. The Asian bond market delivered positive total returns despite modest spread widening led by investment grade amid lower treasury yields. On the final weekend of February, the US and Israel launched military strikes on Iran which caused market volatility and drove widespread flight-to-quality trades. While direct corporate impact on Asia remains limited, the region feels the brunt through potential oil and trade shocks. The US macro backdrop showed some weakness, and the US Supreme Court struck down IEEPA tariffs. Broad Asian corporate fundamentals and investor inflows remained supportive through the month. Corporate default rates are expected to remain modest for Asian issuers in 2026.

Expectation of fund manager

We expect corporate credit performance to be led by carry, with spreads broadly anchored but more likely to drift wider than tighten, as exceptionally strong technicals ebb (net supply marginally picks up and large AI-related investment grade issuance competes for USD demand) and are potentially coupled with persistent geopolitical tensions. Although lower tail-risks on tariffs, diverting supply chains and easier monetary policy delivered in 2025 are supportive, a prolonged escalation in the Middle East poses tail risks for oil prices if the Strait of Hormuz faces extended closure. Energy importers such as Thailand, India, and the Philippines face downward growth pressure from such shocks. Fundamentals start from a robust base (low leverage, positive rating migration and historically low default rates), but tight valuations limit cushion and make selectivity over beta essential. Asia IG spreads still offer attractive pickup versus US IG when taking its lower net leverage into account. We favor BBB-BB rating buckets over the lower-rated segments, remain overweight in financials, stay cautious on cyclical sectors such as chemicals and energy, and expect higher dispersion across HY names.

Top 10 largest positions

The top largest absolute positions are in the sovereign bonds of the Philippines, Alibaba, a Chinese e-commerce and cloud technology giant, IRB, an Indian toll road operator and MTR, Hong Kong's metro operator.

Sector allocation

In our portfolio management, we not only factor in weights, but also spreads and durations (DTS). On that basis, the largest underweights are in sovereigns and state-owned enterprises. These issuers have experienced significant tightening and fiscal risks are on the rise. Our largest overweights are in financial bonds issued by banks, as well as in utilities and transportation. We have underweight risk position in Indonesia, the Philippines and Malaysia, driven by tight valuations. The property sector is underweighted, and we only have selective exposure to the sector as issuers remain exposed to idiosyncratic risks, especially in Mainland China and Hong Kong.

Subordination allocation

In the allocation to the capital structure, we favor the bonds with solid risk-adjusted performance potential while taking into account the beta, sector themes, and the credit cycle. We prefer shorter-dated senior bonds. Within subordinated bonds, we favor Tier-2 over Tier-1 bonds.



Sustainability

Sustainability is incorporated in the investment process by the means of a target universe, exclusions, ESG integration, and a minimum allocation to ESG-labeled bonds. The fund invests in credits issued by companies with a positive or neutral impact on the SDGs. The impact of issuers on the SDGs is determined by applying Robeco's internally developed three-step SDG Framework. The outcome is quantified with a proprietary SDG score methodology, considering both the contribution to the SDGs (positive, neutral or negative) and the extent of this contribution (high, medium or low). At least 50% of the fund is invested in Transition-related Investments contributing to the goals of the Paris Agreement and/or Transition-related Investments with an Environmental and/or Social objective. This is determined through Robeco's Paris Alignment Assessment, which evaluates companies using a Climate Traffic light. In addition, the fund does not invest in credit issuers that are in breach of international norms or where activities have been deemed detrimental to society following Robeco's exclusion policy. Financially material ESG factors are integrated in the bottom-up security analysis to assess the impact on the issuer's fundamental credit quality. Furthermore, the fund invests at least 15% in green, social, sustainable, and/or sustainability-linked bonds. The fund limits exposure to elevated sustainability risks. Lastly, where a credit issuer is flagged for breaching international standards in the ongoing monitoring, the issuer will become subject to exclusion. SDG Impact Alignment

This distribution across SDG scores shows the portfolio weight allocated to companies with a positive, negative and neutral impact alignment with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) based on Robeco's SDG Framework. The framework utilizes a three-step approach to assess a company's impact alignment with the relevant SDGs and assign a total SDG score. The score ranges from positive to negative impact alignment with levels from high, medium or low impact alignment. This results in a 7-step scale from -3 to +3. For comparison, index figures are provided alongside that of the portfolio. Only holdings mapped as corporates are included in the figures.



Sustainalytics ESG Risk Rating


The Portfolio Sustainalytics ESG Risk Rating chart displays the portfolio's ESG Risk Rating. This is calculated by multiplying each portfolio component's Sustainalytics ESG Risk Rating by its respective portfolio weight. The Distribution across Sustainalytics ESG Risk levels chart shows the portfolio allocations broken into Sustainalytics' five ESG risk levels: negligible (0-10), low (10-20), medium (20-30), high (30-40) and severe (40+), providing an overview of portfolio exposure to the different ESG risk levels. 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Environmental Footprint


Environmental footprint expresses the total resource consumption of the portfolio per mUSD invested. Each assessed company's footprint is calculated by normalizing resources consumed by the company's enterprise value including cash (EVIC). We aggregate these figures to portfolio level using a weighted average, multiplying each assessed portfolio constituent's footprint by its respective position weight. For comparison, index footprints are shown besides that of the portfolio. The equivalent factors that are used for comparison between the portfolio and index represent European averages and are based on third-party sources combined with own estimates. As such, the figures presented are intended for illustrative purposes and are purely an indication. Only holdings mapped as corporates are included in the figures.



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ESG Labeled Bonds

The ESG-labeled bond chart displays the portfolio's exposure to ESG-labeled bonds. Specifically, green bonds, social bonds, sustainability bonds, and sustainability-linked bonds. Engagement


Robeco distinguishes between three types of engagement. Value Engagement focuses on long-term issues that are financially material and/or are causing adverse sustainability impacts. The themes can be broken into Environmental, Social, Governance, or Voting-related. SDG Engagement aims to drive a clear and measurable improvement in a company's SDG contribution. Enhanced engagement is triggered by misconduct and focuses on companies severely breaching international standards. The report is based on all companies in the portfolio for which engagement activities have taken place during the past 12 months. Note that companies may be under engagement in multiple categories simultaneously. While the total portfolio exposure excludes double counting, it may not equal the sum of individual category exposures.

Based in Singapore, Thu Ha Chow is Head of Fixed Income Asia and Portfolio Manager Emerging and Asian Credits. Prior to joining Robeco in 2022, she was Portfolio Manager and Asia Strategist at Loomis Sayles & Co and Head of Asian Credit at Aberdeen Asset Management, both in Singapore. Previously Thu Ha worked for 15 years in London where she held senior fixed income positions at Deutsche Asset Management and Threadneedle Asset Management in addition to 3 years in investment banking at Credit Suisse First Boston. She started her career in 1998 after obtaining a Master's in Economics and Philosophy from London School of Economics. Frank Reynaerts is Portfolio Manager Emerging and Asian Credits. Frank joined Robeco in 2011 as a Portfolio Manager Emerging Debt. Prior to that, he was Portfolio Manager Investment Grade Credits at Syntus Achmea, Portfolio Manager Emerging Debt at Lombard Odier and Portfolio Manager Fixed Income at Fortis. Frank started his career in 1997 at ASLK Bank as a Risk Analyst. He holds a Master's in Commercial and Financial Sciences from EHSAL Business School of Brussels and he is a CFA® Charterholder. Evert Giesen is Portfolio Manager Investment Grade in the Credit team. Previously, he was an Analyst, responsible for covering the Automotive sector within the Credit team. Prior to joining Robeco in 2001, Evert worked at AEGON Asset Management for four years as a Fixed Income Portfolio Manager. He has been active in the industry since 1997 and holds a Master's in Econometrics from Tilburg University.

Fiscal product treatment
